WELCOME TO BRIGADE CAMP AT STONY GLEN

Stony Glen is a place to explore and discover in a new and different environment. There is something special about being in the great outdoors, experiencing the adventures of Brigade Camp. It is a chance to gain a new perspective on life. That's true for your approach to Bible study, too. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning.

DAILY JOURNAL

You'll begin each day with the Morning Devotion. This will be your personal devotion. This is a special time for you to be alone with God. During this time you will begin to discover God's story and your role in it. Don't be afraid to ask God the tough questions that you may have about that day's subject. He gave us a mind to do just that. He wants us to ask Him. Also, write down your questions. You may want to ask your leader these questions.

In the afternoon you will meet with your cabin for a time of Bible Exploration. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also important to learn from and with each other. As you engage into each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar thoughts and struggles.

Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others are expecting to hear. Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes. You must be willing to ask the tough questions and be willing to change your mind when presented with God's truth. Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud. Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer. You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

DRIVEN - DAY 1

MORNING DEVOTION

Read: Ephesians 2:1-10

I love racing and not just cars. I watch boat, motorcycle, BMX, horse, just all types of racing. During the race it is important to do well, but the real focus is on figuring out where you want to be for that last stretch of the race. It is where you finish that really matters.

Think about NASCAR; the drivers and their teams have to keep the car running during the long races. Sometimes, they have to make adjustments to the car so that it will perform better on the track. The whole focus is to be near the lead for the last few laps. But there is a lot of risk and tough decisions the team has to make: do we make a quick stop for fuel, or do we have enough to finish the race? What happens if there is a wreck? A lot goes into just trying to finish in the top five, not to mention trying to win the race.

Would watching a race be any fun if the race went on forever; if there never was an end? The whole excitement comes during those last few laps to see who will win. Life is like a race, but we often forget that there is an end to that race as well. I have often heard the question, "What would you do if you knew the day you would die?" How would you live your life?

Scripture tells us that we all will live for eternity somewhere. It is the final finish to our own personal race. This week we will look at the components that impact our race and put us in position to finish well. **Pray in your own words.**

DRIVEN - DAY 1

BIBLE EXPLORATION

Created for a Purpose

Eric Liddell was a Scottish runner and athlete, known as the *Scottish Flyer*. His specialty was the 100 yard race in Briton or the 100 meters in the Olympics. A problem arose in the 1924 Olympics when the qualifying rounds for the 100 meters was scheduled for Sunday. Because of Eric's commitment to follow Christ, Eric refused to run on Sunday.

What are your thoughts? Should Eric have run on Sunday? What would you do? Why?

Knowing that he could not run in the race, Eric trained for the 400 meter race instead. During his training, he had good times but they were not equal to the best runners for that distance. At the Paris Olympics in 1924, Eric won the bronze medal for the 200 meters and qualified for the finals of the 400 meters. Just before the race, a messenger from the US Olympic team slipped him a note with the Bible verse I Samuel 2:30.

Read: I Samuel 2:30

What does this verse mean?

For the 400 meter race, Eric drew the outside lane putting all of the other racers, including the favored American runners, behind him where he could not see them. Not being able to see where the other runners were, Eric decided to run the race as a sprint rather than a traditional middle distance race. Eric finished the race with a World Record Time of 47.6 seconds edging out American, Horatio Fitch (48.4 secs), and fellow Briton, Guy Butler (48.6 secs).

What do you think about Eric Liddell's accomplishment of winning the Gold medal? Is it the greatest accomplishment of his life?

"I believe God made me for a purpose, but he also made me fast! And when I run I feel his pleasure."

Eric Liddell

Here is what Eric thought about it:

It has been a wonderful experience to compete in the Olympic Games and to bring home a gold medal. But since I have been a young lad, I have had my eyes on a different prize. You see, each one of us is in a greater race than any I have run in Paris, and this race ends when God gives out the medals.

In 1925, Eric Liddell returned to China, where his parents served as missionaries. During World War II, Eric refused to leave the country and was captured by the Japanese and placed in a prison camp. He died on February 21, 1945, just 5 months before the camp was liberated. At the 2008 Olympics in China, it was revealed by the Chinese government that Eric refused to be freed from the prison camp and gave his spot to a pregnant woman.

Eric Liddell in his book - *The Disciplines of the Christian Life*

“I believe in God the Father, Almighty, Creator, infinitely holy and loving, who has a plan for the world, a plan for my life, and some daily work for me to do. I believe in Jesus, the Christ, the Son of God, as Example, Lord, and Saviour. I believe in the Holy Spirit who is able to guide my life so that I may know God’s will; and I am prepared to allow him to guide and control my life. I believe in God’s law that I should love the Lord my God with all my heart, and with all my soul, and with all my mind, and with all my strength; and my neighbour as myself. I believe it is God’s will that the whole world should be without any barriers of race, colour, class, or anything else that breaks the spirit of fellowship. To believe means to believe with the mind and heart, to accept, and to act accordingly on that basis.”

DRIVEN - DAY 2

MORNING DEVOTION

Read: Jeremiah 1:1-8

Talents

Like Eric Liddell, God has given us all talents and gifts. And like Jeremiah, God knew us before we were even formed in our mother's womb. The trouble comes when we try to determine what our talents are. Growing up, I wanted to be a baseball player, then a football player, and later a race car driver. We all have dreams, and we need to make sure our talents and skills match our dreams.

Sometimes, we focus too much on our physical talents and ignore our spiritual gifts. For others, we think we should only focus on our spiritual gifts because our physical talents are not spiritual and are sinful. We need to understand that both are from God, and we need to use them to glorify Him.

In the recent movie *Woodlawn*, a pastor of the church recognizes Tony Nathan, the star football player, for using his God given talents and glorifying God with them. Golden State Warriors' basketball star Steph Curry constantly talks about how "the Lord had blessed me with the talent to play the game."

As you go through the day, think of your talents and spiritual gifts. Continue to pray that God would reveal them to you and open ways for you to use them to glorify Him.

Pray: Lord, help me to see the talents and skills that you have blessed me with. Help me to use them to glorify You. Amen.

DRIVEN - DAY 2

BIBLE EXPLORATION

Given Talents

Our talents are God given. Research shows that they are formed deep within our minds, and for most of us they don't change once we reach a certain age. Talents are not skills. We learn skills and gain knowledge, but talent makes us who we are.

Developing Our Talents

In order for us to use our talents to their greatest potential, we need to use them and we need to be humble. Famous UCLA Men's Basketball coach John Wooden said, "Talent is God given. Be humble. Fame is man-given. Be grateful. Conceit is self-given. Be careful."

Living in God's Will

What does it mean to live in the **will** of God. Over the years, I have heard so many different views on the **will** of God. It can become such a fear of being outside the **will** of God that people will resort to different practices to make sure they follow His **will** .

I have heard of people searching the Bible for what they should do for the day. They will close their Bible and open it to a random page and blindly pick a verse to help them decide what they need to do to follow God.

Some will ask you, "Do you know God's will for your life?" This question can have two meanings. One, are you saved and a believer in Jesus Christ? Two, do you know what God wants you to do with your life? They believe that God has only one plan for you. These views on God's will can cause a lot of stress in a person's life. It makes us think, "What if I choose the wrong job or marry the wrong person?"

The verses in Matthew 16:24-26 tell us exactly what we need to follow God's will; we must fully trust Him enough to give our lives to Him and then He will give us our lives back. We will discuss this more in today's Bible X.

Pray: Lord, help me to understand Your **will**. Guide my paths. Send those that would give me wise counsel that I may follow and trust you better. Amen.

DRIVEN - DAY 4

MORNING DEVOTION

Read: 2 Thessalonians 3:10-13

It's All About You

Yesterday, we learned what it means to follow God's will, but how does that work with our actions? It requires us to step out and do. Throughout the Bible God commands us to work. Paul even tells us if we don't work we "shall not eat." Today we would think this is harsh. But, God wants us to be responsible—for ourselves, to our family, to our community, and to Him.

In the movie *Rudy*, the main character Rudy wants to go to Notre Dame and play football. Unfortunately, he is not big enough physically to play, but he has the heart of a tiger. And, he won't stop until he has fulfilled his dream. Our efforts reflect God's glory. It doesn't matter what our role on the team is, if we don't play as hard as we can, unlike Rudy who gave everything, we let the rest of the team down.

Your success in life is directly tied to your effort. Like Eric Liddle who felt God when he ran, when we work to glorify God, we will do some amazing things. It is far easier to steer a moving ship than to get a ship moving.

Today, we will look at the balance between following the will of God and our own effort.

Pray: Lord, help me to understand the balance between You guiding my steps and me moving forward in faith and trust. Help me to glorify You in everything. Amen.

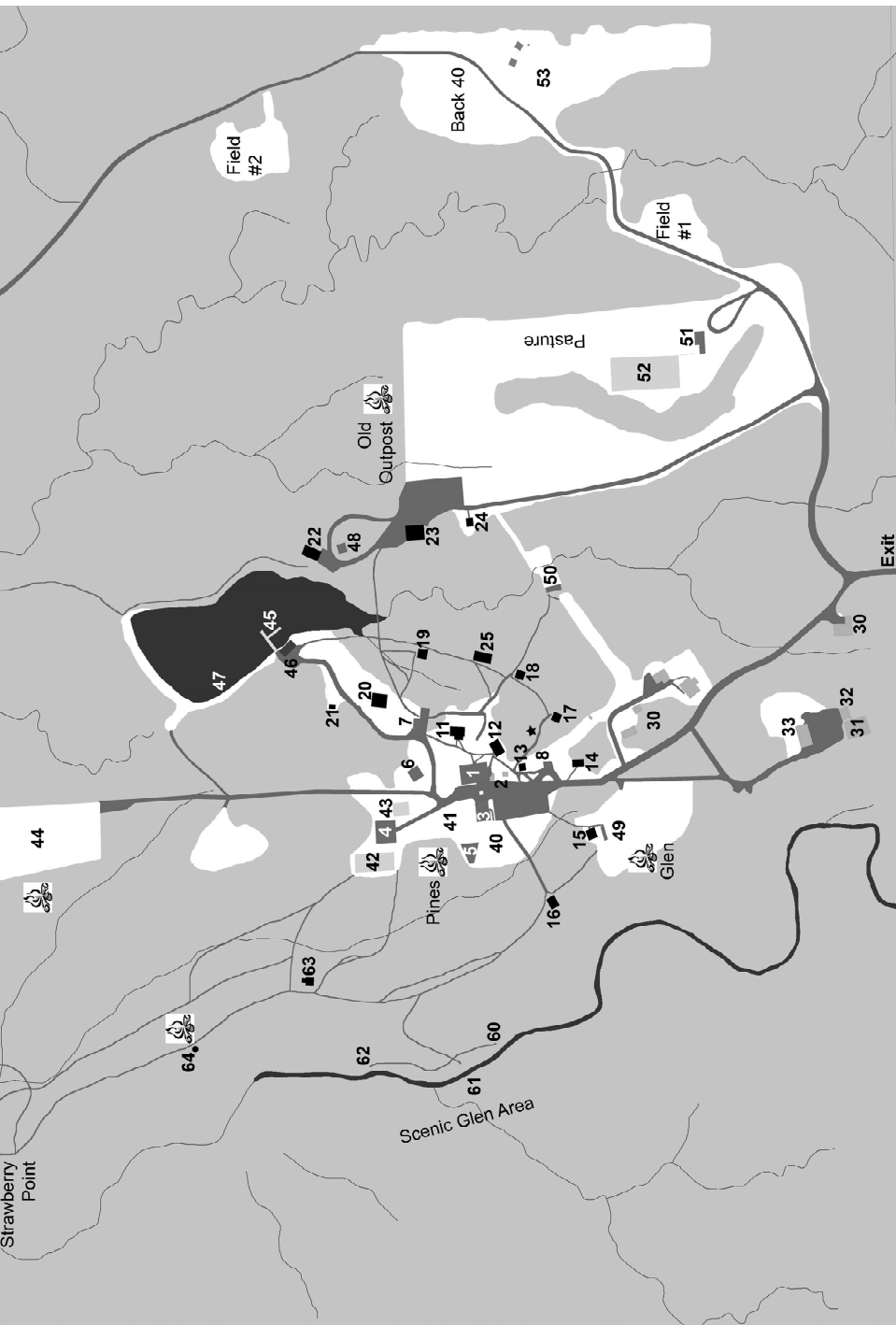

Steph Curry writes on his shoes “I can do all things...” Here is what he says is his reason. “It represents a Bible verse I wear on my shoe. Philippians 4:13. It says ‘I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.’ It’s also my mantra, how I get up for games and why I play the way I do.”

Steph Curry understands the lessons we have discussed so far this week. He understands that, he: was born with a purpose, is given talents by God, follows God’s will, and glorifies God in his actions. He reminds himself with every shot he makes. “I do a little sign on the court every time a make a shot or a good pass and I pound my chest and point to the sky it symbolizes that I have a heart for God. It’s something that my mom and I came up with in college and I do it every time I step on to the floor as a reminder of who I’m playing for.” - Steph Curry.

Is Steph Curry perfect? No! He is a sinner just like the rest of us. But he has a desire to finish well like Paul. He wants to keep the faith.

God wants you to finish well.

Pray: Lord, give me the strength and courage to finish well. Give me Your Spirit that I may finish the race. Amen

Disturb us, Lord, when
We are too pleased with ourselves,
When our dreams have come true
Because we dreamed too little,
When we arrived safely
Because we sailed too close to the shore.

Disturb us, Lord, when with
the abundance of things we possess
We have lost our thirst
For the waters of life;
Having fallen in love with life,
We have ceased to dream of eternity
And in our efforts to build a new earth,
We have allowed our vision
Of the new Heaven to dim.

Disturb us, Lord, to dare more boldly,
To venture on wilder seas
Where storms will show Your mastery;

God's Plan of Salvation

What is God Like

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

What Are We Like

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

God's Solution

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave its only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

Ministries:

Tadpoles/Tree Climbers: For boys (ages 4-7), Pre-K through 2nd Grade
At Tadpoles/Tree Climbers, young boys spend quality time with their dads and other adult Christian men. Together, men and kids have fun, learn about God's creation, and grow closer to God and each other.

Games, projects, adventures and snacks are centered around a weekly theme and Bible verse. Young boys flourish with the one-on-one time with godly men.

Stockade: Boys (ages 8-11), 3rd - 6th Grades
Stockade is a weekly opportunity for guys to spend time with guys. Adult Christian men serve as their role models, and demonstrate Christian Manhood in action and attitude.

Through physical and mental activities, fun, service, achievement and Bible stories, boys develop the foundations of godly character and leadership skills.

Battalion: Young men (ages 12 – 18) 7th – 12th Grades
In CSB's hallmark program, Battalion, adult Christian men disciple teenage boys. Young men grow through physically and mentally challenging activities, Bible studies, service projects and personal hands-on leadership experiences.

Action time, game time, achievement challenges, small group meetings, council rings, adventure outings, and competitions allow young men to gain practical life skills, learn cooperation, develop teamwork – and become leaders of tomorrow.

GEMS: For girls 1st – 12th Grades
