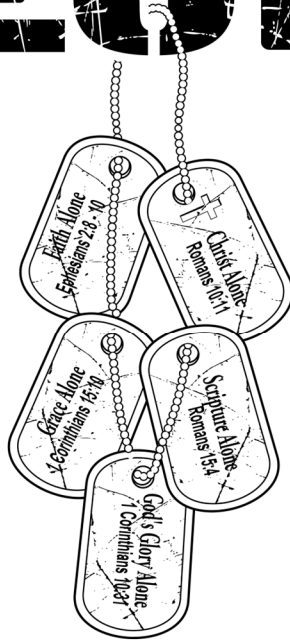

WELCOME TO BRIGADE CAMP AT STONY GLEN

Stony Glen is a place to explore and discover in a new and different environment. There is something special about being in the great outdoors, experiencing the adventures of Brigade Camp. It is a chance to gain a new perspective on life. That's true for your approach to Bible study, too. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning.

DAILY JOURNAL

You'll begin each day with the Morning Devotion. This will be your personal devotion. This is a special time for you to be alone with God. During this time you will begin to discover God's story and your role in it. Don't be afraid to ask God the tough questions that you may have about that day's subject. He gave us a mind to do just that. He wants us to ask Him. Also, write down your questions. You may want to ask your leader these questions.

In the afternoon you will meet with your cabin for a time of Bible Exploration. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also important to learn from and with each other. As you engage into each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar thoughts and struggles.

Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others are expecting to hear. Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes. You must be willing to ask the tough questions and be willing to change your mind when presented with God's truth. Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud. Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer. You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

DAY 1

MORNING FOCUS

Read: Ephesians 6:10-12

Paul calls us to put on the full armor of God. But why would he tell us to do that? Because we are in a battle. And it is no ordinary battle. It is the battle of all time. The royal rumble between good and evil. We are to put on the full armor of God. To prepare. To train.

This year's goal is to train ourselves to be prepared to fight the enemy Paul speaks of in Ephesians 6:12. During the week you will have opportunities to earn merit points. As you earn merit points, you will move up in rank. Your focus will be on what is called the "Five Solas": Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone), Sola Gratia (Grace Alone), Sola Fida (Faith Alone), Sola Christus (Christ Alone), and Sola Deo Gloria (God's Glory Alone).

The apostle Peter commanded us to be prepared to give an answer for what you believe. This past year, a man who always had an answer for those who asked went home to be with his Lord. Mr. Mac, as we called him at camp, was a man that dedicated his life to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He was a true warrior for the lost and dedicated many years at summer camp teaching and leading.

Our hope. My hope. The hope of every leader here at camp is that you would grow to be a great leader. So, like Mr. Mac, you would hear the Lord say to you "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!"

Did you know the Bible you are using came at a price? Not just money but people's lives.

John Wycliffe began work to have the Bible translated from Latin to English in 1382. He died in 1384 but his followers continued his work until it was completed in 1395. Wycliffe's writing and teachings so angered the Pope that he had Wycliffe's bones dug up and burned.

Jan Hus a Czech priest followed Wycliffe with his own translation of the Bible into Czech in 1412. He was tried for heresy and burned at the stake in 1415.

Martin Luther translated the New Testament into German in 1522 and completed the full Bible in 1534. Luther was excommunicated from the church for his teachings. If not for the protection of Fredrick the Wise, Luther would probably have been burned at the stake as well.

William Tyndale worked hard to translate the Bible from the original Hebrew and Greek. He never completed the entire Bible but was able to translate the entire New Testament and some of the Old Testament. He was constantly pursued by the authorities and finally arrested in 1535. He spent a year in prison before being executed by strangulation and then his body was burned. Three of Tyndale's associates were also caught and executed as he was translating the Bible.

DAY 2

MORNING FOCUS

Read: Deuteronomy 20:1

Everyday, we face difficulties. They come in all shapes and forms. It could be a bully, or an illness, or even a difficult test at school. No matter what, God has our back.

In Deuteronomy 31:6, we are told to “Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you.” In Hebrews 13:5, the author reminds us to remember what was said in Deuteronomy 31:6.

President George Washington, demonstrated this belief in God’s protection during the French and Indian War. It was the Battle of Monongahela on July 9, 1755. Washington had two horses shot out from under him and men dying all around. Yet, he still rode on. He later recounted the battle - "By the all-powerful dispensations of Providence I have been protected beyond all human probability or expectation; for I had four bullets through my coat, and two horses shot under me yet escaped unhurt, although death was leveling my companions on every side of me!"

It is our understanding of God’s grace that we can face these battles. It is Grace Alone that helps us build a strong foundation.

Pray: Lord, help me to understand the importance of Your grace and what Grace Alone truly means. Amen

DAY 3

MORNING FOCUS

Today we will look at “Christ Alone.” Christ is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for “Messiah.” When we talk about Christ, we are referring to Jesus of Nazareth.

Read: Luke 4:14-30

Jesus was a warrior for truth. He had all the power of the universe and yet walked humbly, teaching and healing those in need. If you don't think Jesus was a warrior, read verses 28-30 again. The people were ready to throw him off a cliff and what does Jesus do? He walked right through the crowd and went on his way. Have you ever tried to walk through a crowd? Can you imagine trying to walk through a crowd that wants to kill you?

Get ready to meet Jesus the Christ.

Pray: Lord, open our hearts and minds to hear your truth. Let Your Spirit come and reveal Christ to us. Amen.

Everyday, we put our faith in different things. But are they the right things? We need to understand what real faith is. Thomas did not have the faith until he saw Jesus alive and could actually touch him.

Thomas believed in Jesus for the rest of his life, spreading the Gospel all the way to India where it is believed he was killed by the local religious authorities.

Today, we will look at the importance of faith. It is only by faith that we are saved. There is nothing else we can do or add.

Pray: Lord, help me to understand what it means to have faith. Amen.

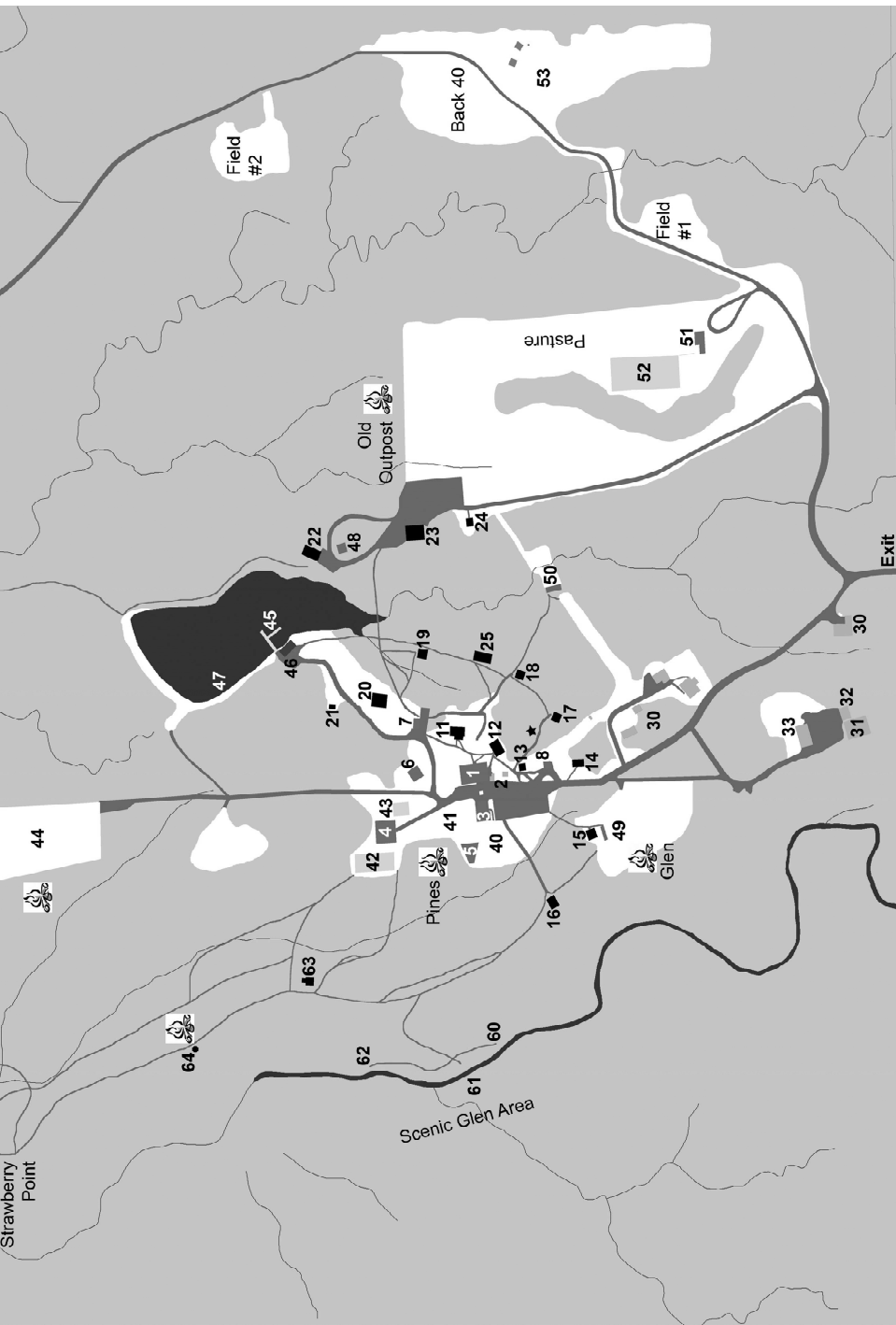

FAITH ALONE

DAY 4

The first three days we looked at:

Scripture Alone - God's word is all we need. There is no other source needed.

Grace Alone - It is by God's grace that we are saved.

Christ Alone - It is through Christ that our salvation comes - His death and resurrection only.

We need to understand that works are important. Christ's sacrifice on the cross does not give us the freedom to sin as much as we want.

Pray: Lord, help us to believe in your grace through Jesus Christ. Give us the faith to fully commit to you. Let your Spirit move through each one of us here. Let us see you be glorified. Amen.

DAY 5

MORNING FOCUS

Read: Psalm 72:18-19

“May the whole earth be filled with his glory.” This is the final part of our study. And everything we have studied so far this week leads us to the last point, the Glory of God Alone.

Let’s look at what God has done. He created the universe with all its majesty, beauty, and mystery. Then he created Adam and Eve in his image. When they rebelled and ate from the tree that God told them not to, God created a plan to save them.

God revealed his plan through the Bible. It points to the coming of the Christ. Then Christ died and rose from the dead. It was all God’s doing. We are saved by his grace through faith as we learned earlier this week. It is all through God’s work. There is nothing we can do to earn salvation. It is a gift. God is filling the whole earth with his glory just for us.

Think about that for a moment. Everything he has done is for us: the writing of scripture, sending his Son to die and later to rise from the dead, giving his grace through faith. All just for you.

One of our great teachers R.C. Sproul put it the best, “We are secure, not because we hold tightly to Jesus, but because He holds tightly to us.”

Pray: Lord, help me today to do everything to glorify you and not myself. Help me to remember that it is you that holds tightly to me. Amen.

DAY 6

MORNING FOCUS

Read: 1 Timothy 4:6-16

Paul tells Timothy to not let people look down on his youth but for him to set an example. We must continually set an example to those who don't know Christ.

I am reminded of a story about the late Chuck Colson, a Christian author and speaker. He was traveling overseas and coming through the custom inspection. The line was really long that day and people were getting frustrated. But Mr. Colson kept his calm and was patient the entire wait. Several years later, Mr. Colson meet a man who became a Christian. The man explained that he had seen Mr. Colson in that line waiting patiently. He had heard Mr. Colson speak about his faith in Jesus Christ and when he saw how Mr. Colson behaved in the line, the man knew there was something different. Soon, after that time the man became a follower of Jesus Christ. You just never know when someone is watching you. Be that example.

There is a great quote attributed to Francis of Assisi. He said, "Preach the gospel at all times. When necessary, use words." It is important to tell people about Jesus. He even commands us to go preach to the entire world. But the point is, we must act out our faith as well. May we be that example.

We all hope and pray that you had a great time at camp and that it will have an impact on your life.

Pray: Lord, send your Holy Spirit to touch the lives of all that have come to this camp. May You be glorified. May Your Spirit move in a mighty way for all of those that head home. Bless them and keep them safe until we see each other again. Amen.

WARRIOR PROFILE

George “Mr. Mac” McFadden



Born: April

15, 1935

Went Home: November 6, 2017

Married to Donna for over 50 years

Many of us knew Mr. Mac. He spent a lot of time at camp mentoring boys and men. He was a warrior for Christ. He fought everyday for the salvation of those around him. He was passionate about sharing the gospel to everyone he met.

George loved to tell his own story of how Jesus changed his life. Before becoming a believer, he was an alcoholic and wanted nothing to do with Christianity. His whole family had become believers in Jesus. But Mr. Mac did not.

Until one day while he was mowing the yard, he was visited by a man from a church where Mr. Mac had previously attended one evening and filled out a visitor's card. The man shared the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection and the bad news of Mr. Mac's sin. Even after being convicted of his own sins, Mr. Mac did not want to accept Jesus as his savior. He asked the man to leave. Before the man left he asked if he could pray for Mr. Mac. The man prayed, "Dear God I shared the good news and the bad

news with Mr. McFadden and right now in the name of Jesus I pray that Mr. McFadden would not sleep tonight until he comes to know you.”

Mr. Mac could not sleep that night. He went to the bathroom, his hiding place, and knelt in front of the bath tub and asked, “Jesus if you can save me, go for it. I know I’m a sinner and all the rotten things I did.”

Mr. Mac loved to ask the question of everyone he met, “If you were to die today do you know for sure you have eternal life?” How about you - where are you spending eternity? To watch Mr. Mac’s testimony in his own words you can find it here:

God's Plan of Salvation

What is God Like

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

What Are We Like

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

God's Solution

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

Your Part

What do you have to do? Jesus' death allows you to be friends with God. Here is what you have to do:

1. Believe Jesus died for you personally.
2. Tell Jesus you are sorry for the sin in your life and want to be changed.
3. Ask Jesus to take away your sins and to direct your life.

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:9)

When you give your life to Jesus, you become His child and belong to His family! Wow! What could be better?

THE ARMOR OF GOD

Armor Memory Verse 1

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

Armor Memory Verse 2

Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.

Armor Memory Verse 3

Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace.

Armor Memory Verse 4
