It is a chance to gain a new perspective on life. That's true for your approach to Bible study, too. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning.

## DAILY JOURNAL

You'll begin each day with the Morning Devotion. This will be your personal devotion. This is a special time for you to be alone with God. During this time you will begin to discover God's story and your role in it. Don't be afraid to ask God the tough questions that you may have about that day's subject. He gave us a mind to do just that. He wants us to ask Him. Also, write down your questions. You may want to ask your leader these questions.

In the afternoon you will meet with your cabin for a time of Bible Exploration. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also important to learn from and with each other. As you engage into each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar thoughts and struggles.

Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others are expecting to hear. Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes. You must be willing to ask the tough questions and be willing to change your mind when presented with God's truth. Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud. Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer. You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

# DAY 1

## MORNING FOCUS

**Read: Judges 6:11-12**

I often think about what it would be like if an Angel of the Lord came down to me and told me. “The Lord is with you, you mighty man of valor.” Wow, that is just so awesome. Think about that, an Angel told Gideon he was a “mighty man of valor.” Isn’t that what we want? Or is it?

During my study of Gideon, I heard one teacher suggest what we want is “a safe Christianity.” We want the miracles but we really don’t want the trouble that would require a miracle. So we pray for God’s blessing and strength but what we really mean is for God to just leave us alone so we can have fun with no trouble or pain.

And when the trouble and pain comes, who do we blame? God. Sometimes, I even get mad at God. Then later I realize just how stupid that was. We so want life to be easy. Psychologist, Jordan Peterson said, “Life is suffering.” What does that mean? I think life is about struggle; it’s about survival.

Where does a loving God fit into this idea of “life is suffering?” What is God’s idea of survival? This week we will look at biblical stories of struggle and survival. I pray you have a great week of adventure, fun, and growth.

# DAY II

## MORNING FOCUS

You have probably heard the story of the fiery furnace. How God rescued Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego. We are going to go deeper into this study.

My favorite phrase from this lesson is "but if not." In the face of difficulties and troubles, are we willing to follow God even if we may not survive? My God can save me, but if not, I will still follow him. Are we willing to do that. Or does our safe Christianity get in the way.

Let's remember the world is not safe. God did create the lion and the lion is not safe.

# DAY III

## MORNING FOCUS

**Read: Acts 6:1-7**

The Apostles were busy preaching and teaching the people throughout the area. A dispute arose over how some of the widows were being treated. This made it hard for the Apostles to go out and preach.

So, the Apostles ask the multitude of disciples to find seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit, and wisdom. Notice the Apostles don't ask for someone that is a hard worker or a great organizer. They are looking for men who are following God and following Him well. Would God call you?

Also, this seems like a pretty easy job. Sounds like a safe Christian job. No trouble, just make sure the widows are taken care of. But God to use even those we may overlook.

Today, we will look at the courage of Stephen, one of those chosen to serve the widows. We will see how he survives against false accusations of blasphemy and other lies.

**Pray: Lord, help us to see your truth and love through the story of your servant, Stephen. Amen.**

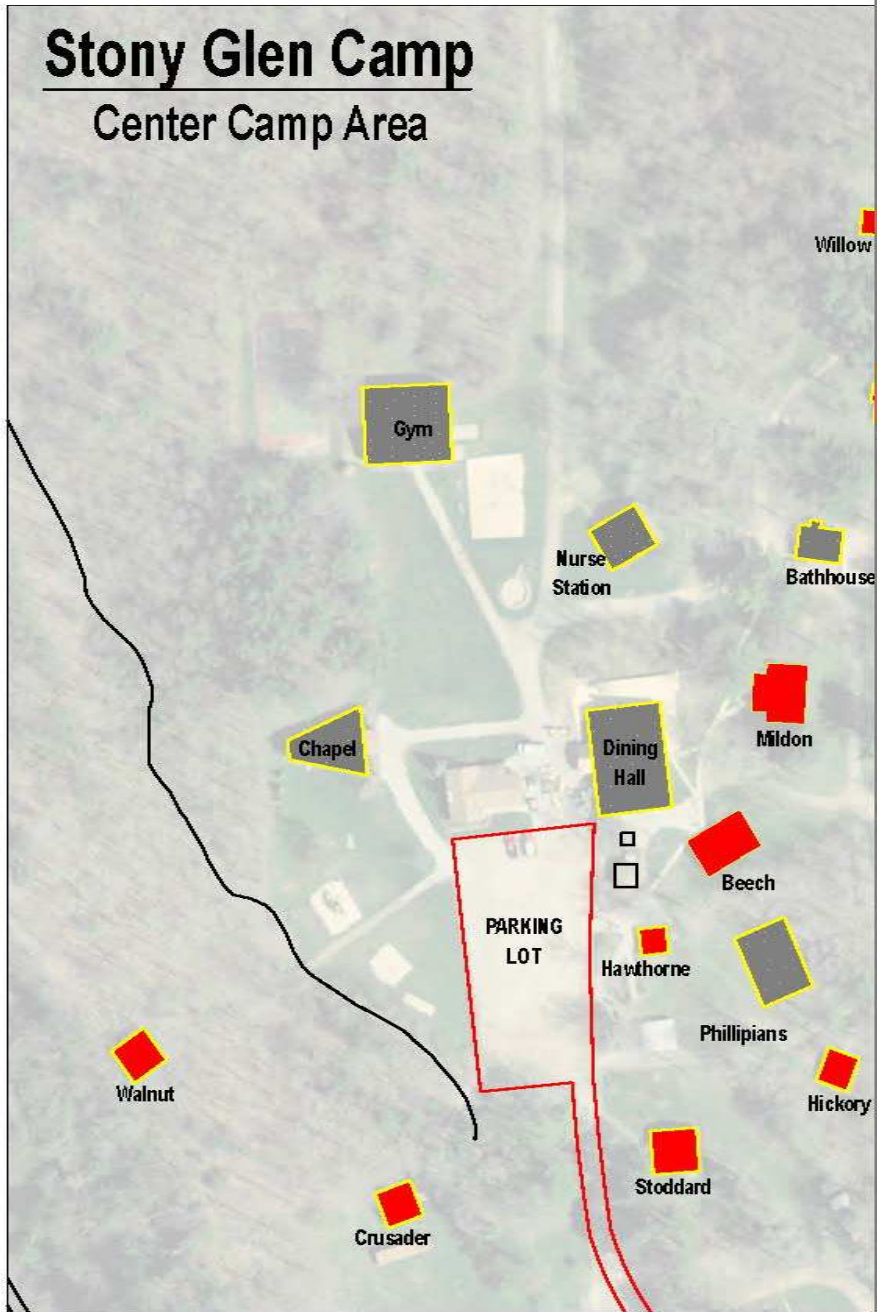

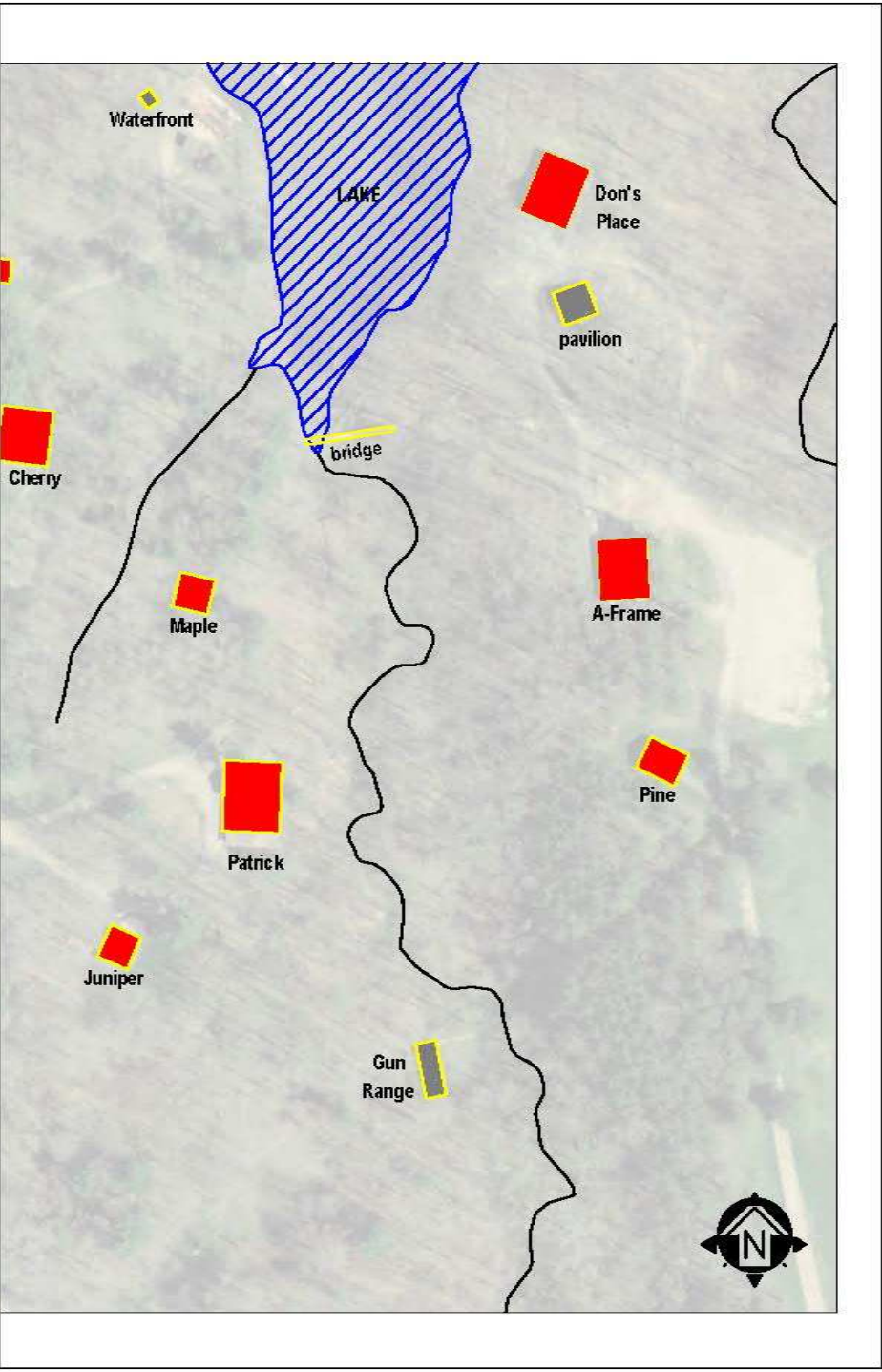

# DAY IIII

## MORNING FOCUS

Peter said that Jesus was “the Christ, the Son of the Living God.” He knew exactly who he was following. Peter wanted to be part of Jesus becoming King of Israel. The Jews wanted to be rid of the Romans. Peter didn’t want to be a safe Christian. He was ready to take up his sword and follow Jesus to Jerusalem where Jesus would become King.

However, Jesus had other plans. His aim was higher and would require suffering and even death. Jesus needed to suffer for us, for you and me.

Today, we will look at the death of Jesus through the eyes of Peter. We will see how Peter survived the turmoil of seeing his King die after all the miracles he witnessed; Peter believed Jesus would save his people based on all the promises of the Messiah rescuing the people of Israel from the Romans.

# DAY IIIII I

## MORNING FOCUS

**Read: John 19:28-30**

Jesus said, “It is finished.” Your survival is not about what you have done, whether great or bad. The gospel (the good news) is about what Jesus did for each one of us on that cross on that day as foretold centuries before Jesus was even born. There is nothing we can do.

As much as all of us want to be the hero, we (YOU) are not the hero of the story. Jesus is the only real hero of the story. He is the one that gives us victory over death. He is the only path to truth and salvation. I pray you have made that decision this week or have deepened your relationship with the Lord. If you have not made that decision, why not? If you have more questions, please talk to one of the leaders here before you leave. Don’t wait.

There was nothing special about the people we learned about this week. What made all of them special was their faith in the Lord and ultimately in what Jesus did.

Remember what Jesus said, “I have said these things to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.” (John 16:33) Make sure you find friends that will help you through difficult times. Find your fellowship, your band of brothers, that will go into the battle with you and will tell you the truth even when it is hard.

Go with the peace and love of the Lord Jesus the Christ.

**Pray: Lord, thank you for what you have done this week. May You be glorified. Let Your Spirit touch the lives of those that head home. Bless them and keep them safe until we see each other again. Amen.**

# SURVIVAL

## Survival Tip #1 - Rule of 3

### You can go:

- 3 Minutes without Air
- 3 Hours without Shelter
- 3 Days without Water
- 30 Days without Food

This is about prioritizing your needs and making the right decisions. If you are hiking in the wilderness or driving in a snow storm and get stuck it is important that you understand what is import and to take appropriate action.

## Survival Tip #2 - Be Prepared

Create an emergency bag or first aid kit for your house and/or vehicles. Here is a list of items recommended by the American Red Cross:

- Water and Food
- Flashlight
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible)
- Extra batteries
- Deluxe family first aid kit
- Medications (7-day supply) and medical items
- Multi-purpose tool
- Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- Cell phone with chargers
- Family and emergency contact information
- Extra cash
- Emergency blanket
- Map(s) of the area
- Games and activities for children
- Entertainment items
- Extra set of car keys and house keys
- Manual can opener
- Whistle
- N95 or surgical masks
- Lighter and/or Matches
- Rain gear
- Towels
- Work gloves
- Extra clothing, hat and sturdy shoes
- Duct tape
- Scissors
- Blankets or sleeping bags

# SURVIVAL

## **Survival Tip #3 - Fire Starting**

To start a fire, you need to have a lighter, matches, or other fire starters (magnesium).

Create a tinder bundle: Gather pine needles, dry leaves, milkweed or thistle down and dry grass for tinder.

- Start small: Gather small, dry sticks for kindling.
- Go big: Find larger pieces of wood for long-burning fuel.
- Put it together: Using a larger piece of wood as a wind block, create a nest out of the tinder. Create a tipi out of smaller kindling so oxygen can get in. Ignite the tinder and place under the tepee. Use long, steady breaths to spread the flame. As the smaller pieces catch, add progressively larger fuel to the fire.

Do you have Chapstick or Vaseline? If you have problems starting a fire, you can use Chapstick/Vaseline with a cotton ball or other material to start a fire. Mix the Chapstick/Vaseline with the cotton ball and then light it.

## **Survival Tip #4 - Build a Shelter**

Keep it small. Start with larger sticks for supports and work to smaller sticks to fill the gaps. Make sure to insulate with bark, leaves, pine needles, and moss—the ticker the material the better.

## **Survival Tip #5 - Know Where You Are Going**

Always let someone you know where you are going. If an accident happens at least someone will know where you are. Day hikers and hunters are statistically most likely to get lost. They are usually carrying only some basic gear and are not prepared for survival situations.

Make sure you know your surroundings and be aware of what is happening around you. You should never walk alone with headphones. And never get in a car with a stranger.

# GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION

## **What is God Like**

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

## **What Are We Like**

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

## **God's Solution**

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave is only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

## **Your Part**

What do you have to do? Jesus' death allows you to be friends with God. Here is what you have to do:

1. Believe Jesus died for you personally.
2. Tell Jesus you are sorry for the sin in your life and want to be changed.
3. Ask Jesus to take away your sins and to direct your life.

*If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:9)*

When you give your life to Jesus, you become His child and belong to His family! Wow! What could be better?
