Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning.

Daily Journal

You'll begin each day with the Morning Devotion. This will be your personal devotion. This is a special time for you to be alone with God. During this time you will begin to discover God's story and your role in it. Don't be afraid to ask God the tough questions that you may have about that day's subject. He gave us a mind to do just that. He wants us to ask Him. Also, write down your questions. You may want to ask your leader these questions.

In the afternoon you will meet with your cabin for a time of Bible Exploration. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also important to learn from and with each other. As you engage into each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar thoughts and struggles.

Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others are expecting to hear. Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes. You must be willing to ask the tough questions and be willing to change your mind when presented with God's truth. Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud. Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer. You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

Day 1

Morning Focus

Where does freedom come from? Is it given to us by our government? Does freedom really exist? To understand freedom, we need to go back to the beginning. The very beginning.

Read: Genesis 2:15-17

As we read in Genesis 2, we see that God puts the man, Adam, in the garden of Eden, and Adam is to work in the garden and take care of it. God has given Adam a responsibility. He is responsible for the garden. But how does responsibility go with freedom?

Let's look at what God does next. He tells Adam that, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." God has offered Adam a choice. Freedom at its core is really the ability to have a choice, and that first choice for man was from God himself. God is the creator of freedom.

But let's remember that before God gave us freedom, he gave us responsibility. As we get older, we are given more and more responsibility, and as a result, we are also given more and more choices in life. This week we will be taking a look at freedom.

Pray: Lord open my mind and heart to your truth and wisdom. Help me to seek You this week. Amen

PRAY: Lord Jesus, I need You. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins. I open the door of my life and receive You as my Savior and Lord. Thank You for forgiving my sins and giving me eternal life. Take control of the throne of my life. Make me the kind of person You want me to be.

Day 2

Morning Focus

Read: Luke 12:22-34

What makes you afraid? Are you afraid of the dark? Are you afraid of a bully? Or are you afraid of getting sick? With all the news about the Coronavirus, there is a lot of fear, even among Christians. How are we to respond to fear?

In human history, there have been countless times where a disease like the Coronavirus has caused humans to fear. I am so thankful that today we have modern medicine and much better living conditions to deal with these types of diseases. But yet we still live in fear. If we are believers in Jesus Christ, we are called to act boldly, even in the face of fear. Listen to what Bishop Cyprian said during one such disease that killed almost 25% of the Roman Empire:

“What a grandeur of spirit it is to struggle with all the powers of an unshaken mind against so many onsets of devastation and death! what sublimity, to stand erect amid the desolation of the human race, and not to lie prostrate with those who have no hope in God; but rather to rejoice, and to embrace the benefit of the occasion; that in thus bravely showing forth our faith, and by suffering endured, going forward to Christ by the narrow way that Christ trod, we may receive the reward of His life and faith according to His own judgment.”

To rejoice in the Lord even in the face of possible death, what a strong faith our Christian ancestors showed.

Pray: Lord, prepare my heart today to learn about a faith that will trust you and help me to stand boldly in the face of fear. Amen

Day 3

Morning Focus

Yesterday, we looked at freedom from fear, and I asked the question, what are you afraid of? Me I am afraid of what Jesus says in Matthew 7. Am I just a Christian in name only, or am I following the will of the Father who is in heaven?

The problem today is we see God as love, and we forget that he is also a God of justice and of wrath. Some say to me, “well, that’s not the God I follow.” Sorry, that’s not the God of the Bible. Remember, Noah and the flood. God destroyed everyone but one family. But that is in the Old Testament. Really. I suggest you read the Book of Revelation. We forget that God is holy.

But God is faithful, and we can trust Him. We learned that Jesus Christ has set us free, and we can be free from fear because of God’s love for us. We are also free from God’s wrath and final judgment. Today, we will learn about God’s wrath, how it reveals His glory, and how Jesus ultimately takes that wrath upon himself.

Maybe it is time for you to truly be free from the law and follow Christ with all your heart, soul, and mind.

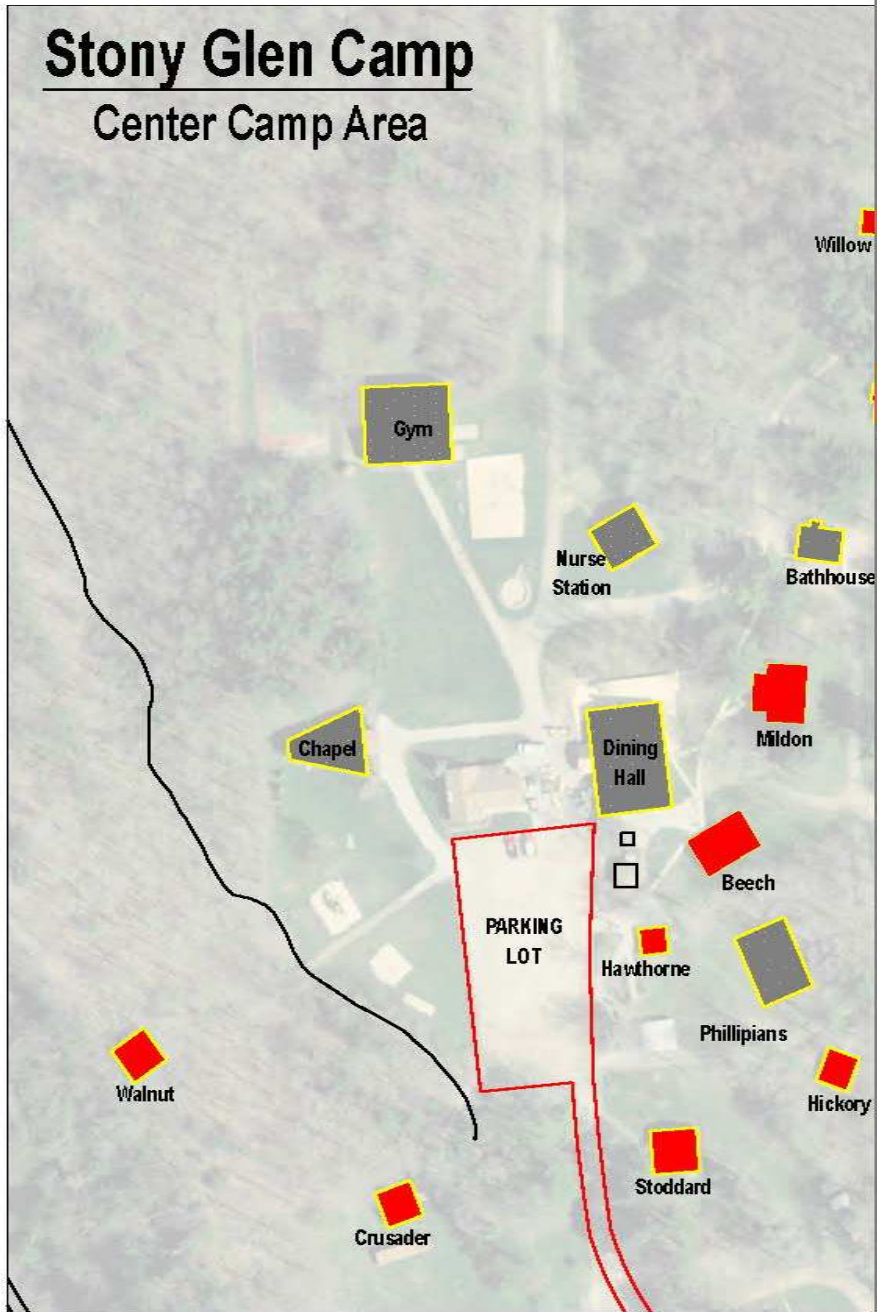
Pray: Lord, through your blood, I have been set me free from the law. As you have said, I am a fellow heir with Christ. Continue to grow my faith and trust in you. Amen

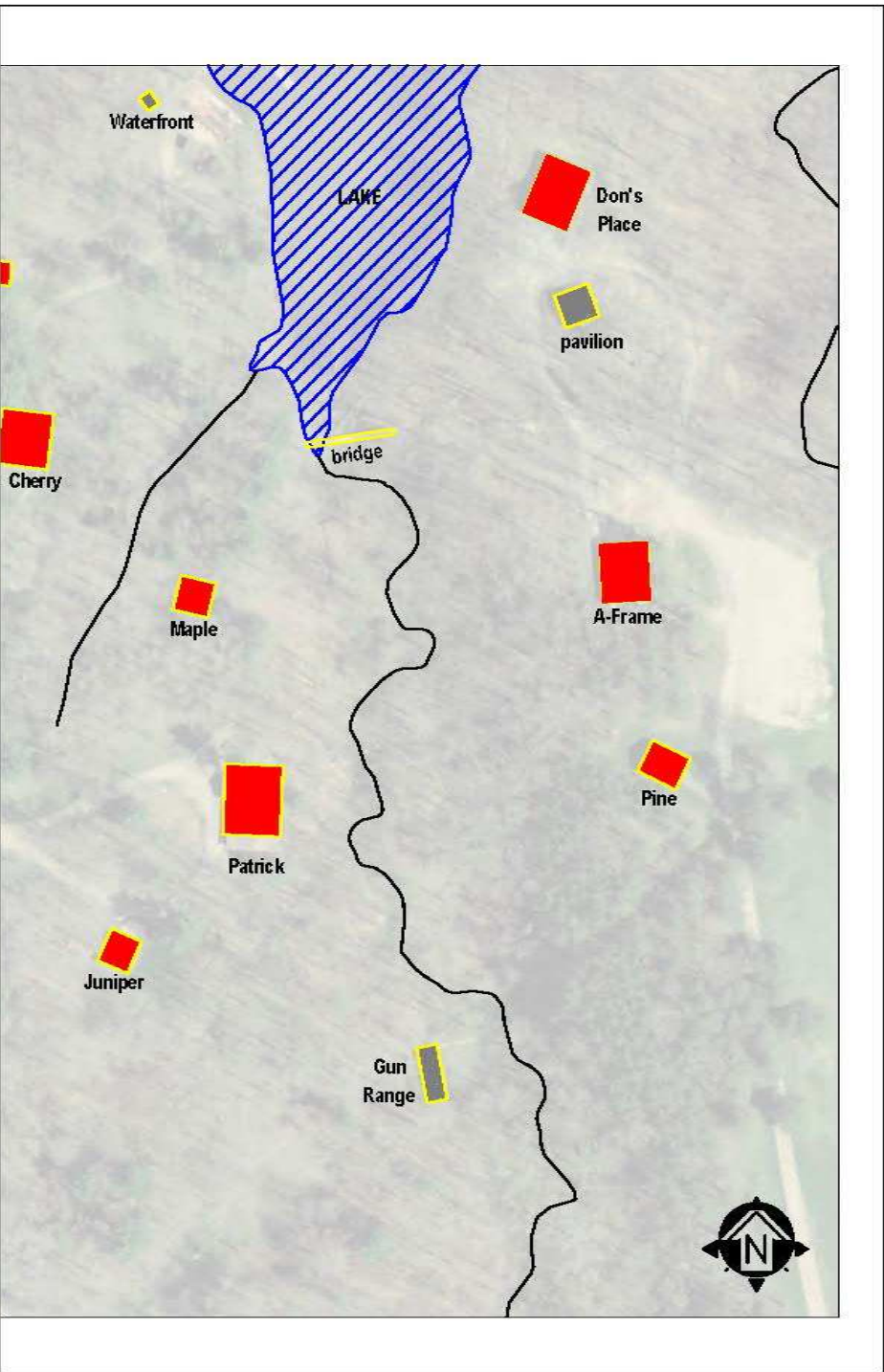

Morning Focus

Moses asked to see God, and God's response is that Moses could see His back because seeing His face would kill Moses. That is how righteous and holy God is. Seeing Him would destroy us. Why? Because we are sinners, and He is holy.

Have you ever had to stand in the hot sun all day? Without water and proper protection, it would kill us. Same with God. But here is the amazing thing. Look at Hebrews 4:16, *"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."* We are now capable of drawing near to the very throne of God.

How is it that we can approach the throne of a holy God? Look at Hebrews 10:19-22, *"Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water."*

Because of what Jesus did on the cross, we can approach the Father without fear. Today we will look at how we can do just that.

Pray: Lord help me to draw closer to you with confidence. Help me to see your face and glorify you. Amen

God's Plan of Salvation

What is God Like

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

What Are We Like

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

God's Solution

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

Your Part

What do you have to do? Jesus' death allows you to be friends with God. Here is what you have to do:

1. Believe Jesus died for you personally.
2. Tell Jesus you are sorry for the sin in your life and want to be changed.
3. Ask Jesus to take away your sins and to direct your life.

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:9)

When you give your life to Jesus, you become His child and belong to His family! Wow! What could be better?
