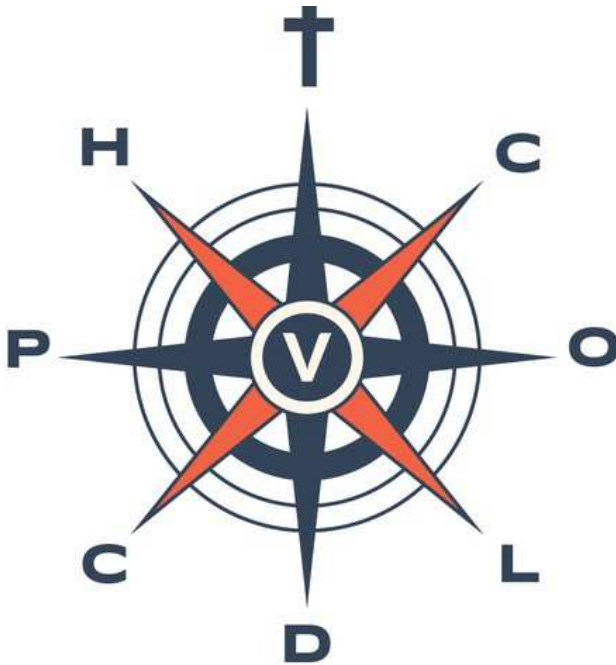


Valor

Welcome to Ohio Brigade Camp

We are so excited you could join us here at Ohio Brigade Camp. It is a place of beauty and adventure and a place dedicated to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with all those that visit. Joe Coughlin, along with a group of young Frontiersmen from across the country (with several members from Goss Memorial Church), held the first Brigade Camp in Ohio in 1945. The Milner family caught the vision and, in 1947, purchased the property which became known as Stony Glen. Ohio Brigade Camp has been held each summer at Stony Glen since 1948.

There is something special about being in the great outdoors and experiencing the adventures of Brigade Camp. It has a long history of impacting the families that come here. Some families have been coming here for multiple generations. Maybe you are part of one of those families, or maybe you are a new family and will make this a new tradition.

We hope you will have a chance to gain a new perspective on life. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning. **What you get out of camp is what you put into camp.**

What to Expect

Morning Focus

You'll begin each day with the flag raising and then your Morning Focus. This will be your morning devotion time as a family. It is a time for the family to be together with God. Here is what you need:

- Your Bible and Bible X book.
- Read the Bible passage listed in the Bible X book.
- Read the Bible X text.
- Think about what it is teaching.
- Write down any questions you may have.
- Pray.
- Study the Memory Verse.

Group Study

In the afternoon, you will meet with your cabin for a time of Group Study. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also essential to learn from and with each other. As you engage in each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar ideas and struggles. Here are some important points for the Group Study:

- Bring your Bible and Bible X book.
- This time is for you. What you put in is what you get out.
- Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others expect to hear.
- Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes.
- Ask questions. You must be willing to ask tough questions.
- Listen to the answers.
- Be ready to change your mind when presented with truth from God's Word.
- Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud.
- Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer.
- Don't ridicule others for their answers. Life is hard; we need to support one another.

You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

Cabin Devotions

After the campfire, you will have some time to do a short cabin devotion. This is a time as a cabin when you can reflect on what was said during the campfire or recap the day's lessons. Take time to discuss anything that struck you or anyone else in the cabin. This is a great opportunity to discuss how we can apply what we have learned to our personal walk with Christ.

Men of Valor: The Powerful Impact of a Righteous Man

Day 1 - Morning Focus

Read Genesis 1:1-2

We are living in one amazing story. It is God's story. He is the author and the hero of this story. Did you know you were part of a story? You are a special character and have your own story.

When we think of a story, we think of books we have read, movies we have watched, or stories from history about the great things people have done. But great people from history are no different from you or me. We just remember their story. Think about George Washington and the great things he did. Do you think he had friends when he was growing up? Of course he did. However, we don't talk about his friends, but I'm sure they had a major impact on George Washington's life and helped him become the man that he was.

And this is the point – your story intersects with other people's stories, and your story impacts their story. You are like the friends of George Washington. Your impact can have greater significance in the lives of others. Ultimately your story is part of this much bigger and grander story. God's story. What the story needs now is more men of valor. Are you a man of valor? Let's explore what it means to be a man of valor, and let's strive with everything we have to be one.

Pray: Lord, help us to see what it means to be a man of valor. Help me to follow You and mold me into a hero to the people around me so that You would be glorified. Amen

This week we will look at CSB Ministries' 7 points (characteristics) of valor - Honor, Chivalry, Loyalty, Dedication, Purity, Obedience, and Courage.

How do these characteristics match the ones you listed?

Honor

What does honor mean?

A man of honor is a man of integrity; he guards every word and action against falsehood.

The challenge is to not just know the right stuff but to apply it. If people around us are to see Jesus in us, our word and action must be true.

Read: Ephesians 4:25

How are we to speak?

Honor is a characteristic that cannot be taken from us. Honor can only be lost. The military gives an Honorable Discharge for serving well and a Dishonorable Discharge for those that did not serve well.

Why do you think honor is only something we can lose?

Read: Proverbs 22:1

What is the value of a name?

A good name reflects well. This is why if you call yourself a Christian, you are representing Jesus Christ. Are you honoring His name?

Chivalry

A chivalrous man shows respect for others. He is considerate and puts others before himself.

When I think of chivalry, I think of a medieval knight. Based on the definition above, what do you think of when I say the word chivalry?

Read: Philippians 2:3-4

What does this verse call us to do?

How are we to do that?

How are you putting others first?

But a knight also stands for the weak and for justice.

Read: Isaiah 1:16-17

What are we to do?

This is not justice as the world sees it. It is justice as God sees it.
How can we live like that today?

PRAY: Lord Jesus, Help us to be honorable, to represent you with love and peace, helping those who are weak and need our protection. Help us to stand as a shield for them. Amen

Day 2 - Morning Focus

Read: 2 Timothy 4:9-18

During this time, Paul faced many challenges, but he never lost hope.

One friend after another left Paul during his time of need. The only one who stayed was Luke. Luke shows how he is a man of valor with his demonstration of courage, obedience, loyalty, and dedication to Paul and the Lord. Do you have friends like Luke? Are you standing by a friend like Luke does for Paul?

And Paul shows how he is a man of valor by having the courage to stand against Alexander, the metalworker, and by being loyal, dedicated, and obedient to the Lord. What did the Lord do for Paul? He stood by Paul's side and gave him strength in the face of evil.

We need to be men of valor like Luke and Paul.

Pray: Lord, help me to be a man of valor like Luke and Paul. Give me the strength to follow you. Amen

Day 2 - Group Study

Today we will continue looking at the seven points of Valor, loyalty, and dedication.

Loyalty

A man who is loyal is one who is true in affection and allegiance.

Life is not a series of quick fixes. It is largely the task of 3 steps forward, and two steps back. It is the rushing game on the gridiron. Loyalty was modeled by Jesus, who was loyal to His Father even unto death. We are called to live out this kind of loyalty first toward God and then toward other people.

Read: Luke 22:39-44

What did Jesus ask His Father to do in verse 42?

What did Jesus sweat in verse 44?

Even when Jesus was going to die, He was still loyal to His Father. We are to be like Jesus and be loyal to God as well.

Read: Acts 5:27-32

What did the high priest say to the apostles in verse 28?

How did Peter respond?

Who is Peter loyal to?

Read: John 15:13

How does a friend show his love?

If we are truly loyal, we will help a friend when he is in need.

Do you stand up for a friend when he needs you?

Read: 2 Timothy 4:9-18

Why did Demas leave Paul?

Demas loved the world more than he loved Paul or God. Are there examples of that today?

Do you love the world more than God?

What does Paul say about his friends in verse 16?

Are you a friend that truly shows his love?

Refer to your answer at the top of this page on what a true friend is.

To be loyal, we must be dedicated to God, and that is what we will look at next.

Dedication

A dedicated man is one who has committed his whole self to the Lord Jesus Christ.

God created every part of us. Jesus saved every part of us. As both creator and savior, He is entitled to have every part of whom we are dedicated to honoring him. As a result, we can be assured of the benefits of knowing Him: peace, hope, joy, and freedom!

Read: Romans 12:1-2

We are to present ourselves as a “_____.”

Why should we present ourselves this way?

Why does verse 2 say to be transformed by the renewing of your mind and not a transformation of the heart?

Read: Mark 7:20-23

What does Jesus say about the heart?

This is why every day we need to work hard to follow Him.

Read: 1 Corinthians 15:58

How are we to live and work?

Read: 2 Timothy 4:7

How did Paul do in the race?

This is how we show dedication to God, by always doing our best for Him in everything we do.

Pray: Ask the Lord to help you to be loyal and dedicated to each other, your friends, your family, and the Lord.

Day 3 - Morning Focus

What kind of fruit do you produce? A man of valor produces good fruit. He teaches in truth and love. This is hard because everyone around us tries to get us to do the opposite, even our friends and family. We must stand and do what is right but not in a way that makes us look better than others. We are commanded not to brag about our good deeds. In everything we do, we need to show the love of Jesus Christ. We are to glorify Him and Him alone.

Today, we will study purity and obedience. These can be the hardest of the seven points of valor, but when we put these together with the other five, we can begin to see the fruit of the Spirit.

Pray: Lord, help me to follow you. Make my heart pure so that I may be a witness to those that don't know You and that You would be glorified. Amen.

Day 3 - Group Study

Purity

A man who is pure is clean in heart, mind, speech, and body.

Our materialistic society is a breeding ground for idols and temptations. Every part of who we are needs to ring true to the Good News. A pure heart is possible, but only when we place our trust in Jesus and receive His righteousness. When this happens, we are then able to begin seeking to live consistently with the purity that God has already applied to us in Jesus.

Read: Psalm 119:9-11

How can a young person stay on the path of purity?

Read: Philippians 4:8

What are we to think about?

Read: Psalms 51:10

What are we to ask God to create in us?

Can we create a pure heart on our own?

What did we learn yesterday about the heart? See Mark 7:20-23 if you need a refresher.

Read: 2 Corinthians 5:17

What happens to those that are in Christ?

What does it mean to be in Christ?

Read: Philippians 1:9-11

Where does the righteousness come from?

Read: 1 Timothy 4:12

Even though you are young, how are you to act?

You do not have an excuse for being young. You still need to follow Christ.

Obedience

An obedient man is one who follows the commands of God's Word and complies with the wishes of those in authority over him.

A man who knows how to obey will be better able to lead others. We need to hear God's voice. We need to know it intimately. We need to let it sink deep into our souls so that His desires become ours. Obedience puts our faith into action.

Benjamin Franklin said, "He that cannot obey, cannot command." But this goes even further back to Aristotle, who said, "He who has never learned to obey cannot be a good commander."

Read: Psalm 119:33

We are to follow the Lord's decrees until the _____.

Read: Deuteronomy 11:1

What are we to do?

Read: Romans 13:14

How are we to clothe ourselves?

How do we do this?

Read: Romans 13:13

When we put verses 13 and 14 together, do we understand what Paul means about clothing ourselves in the Lord Jesus Christ?

Read: Ephesians 6:1-3

Obedience starts at home. How are we to treat our parents?

When we follow the commands and the word of God, He will bless us.

Remember, if you want to lead, you need to learn to follow.

"You have to have courage to be obedient to God." – Charles Stanley

Pray that each of you will have the strength to follow Christ in obedience and that He will make your hearts pure through Him.

Day 4 - Morning Focus

Read: 1 Samuel 17:32-33

Oh, to have the courage of David. He trusted God with his life every day. He faces lions and bears. What is a giant to one that follows God? The Bible says David was a man after God's own heart.

There are so many courageous men of valor in the Bible. The Apostles boldly preached the good news about Jesus, and many of them were martyred for following Jesus. And there have been even more men of valor that are not written in the Bible, like Ignatius and Polycarp, who were both pupils of the Apostle John. Both were killed for following Jesus.

So many great men of valor risked everything for their faith in Jesus Christ, and yet we are afraid to talk to our friends, our family, our neighbors, and even strangers about what we believe. It's time we stand up and proclaim the good news.

Pray: Lord, help us to understand better you're why we need to share your gospel with others. Help us to speak your truth boldly. Amen

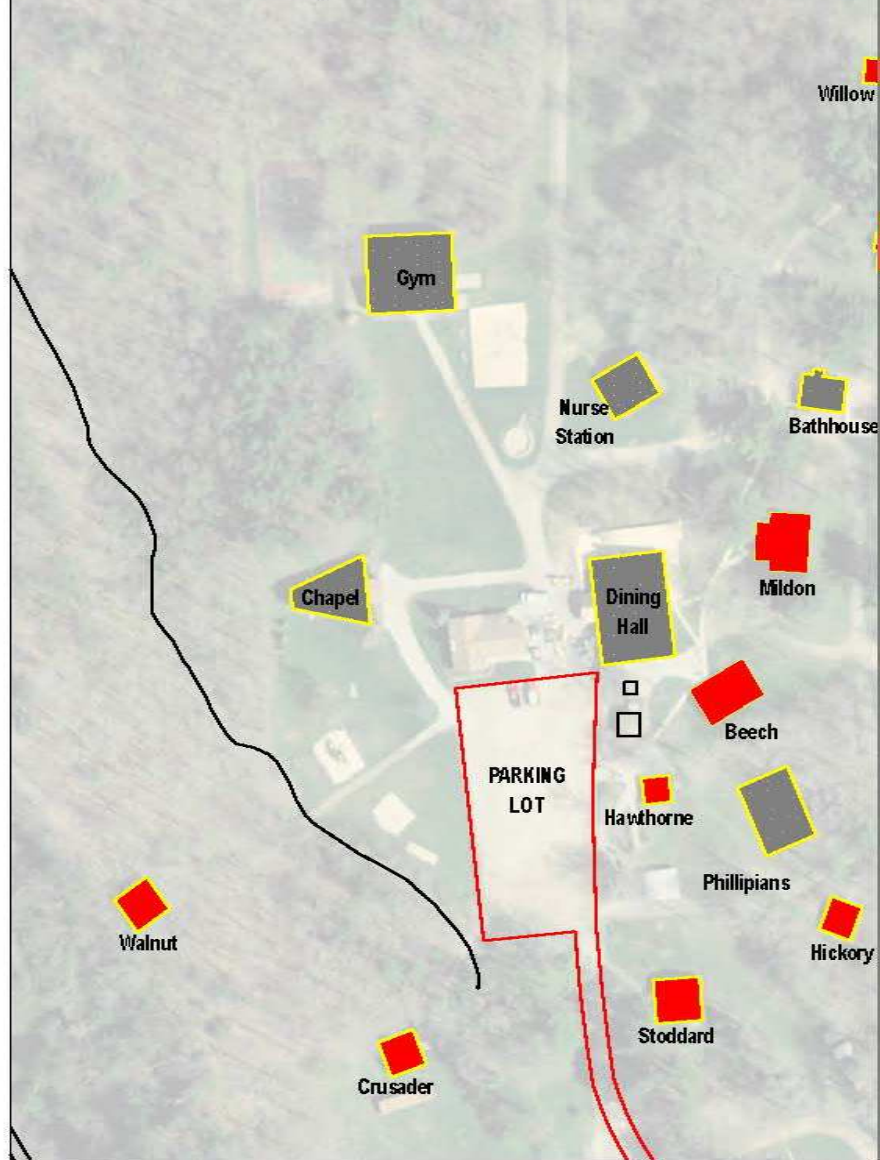

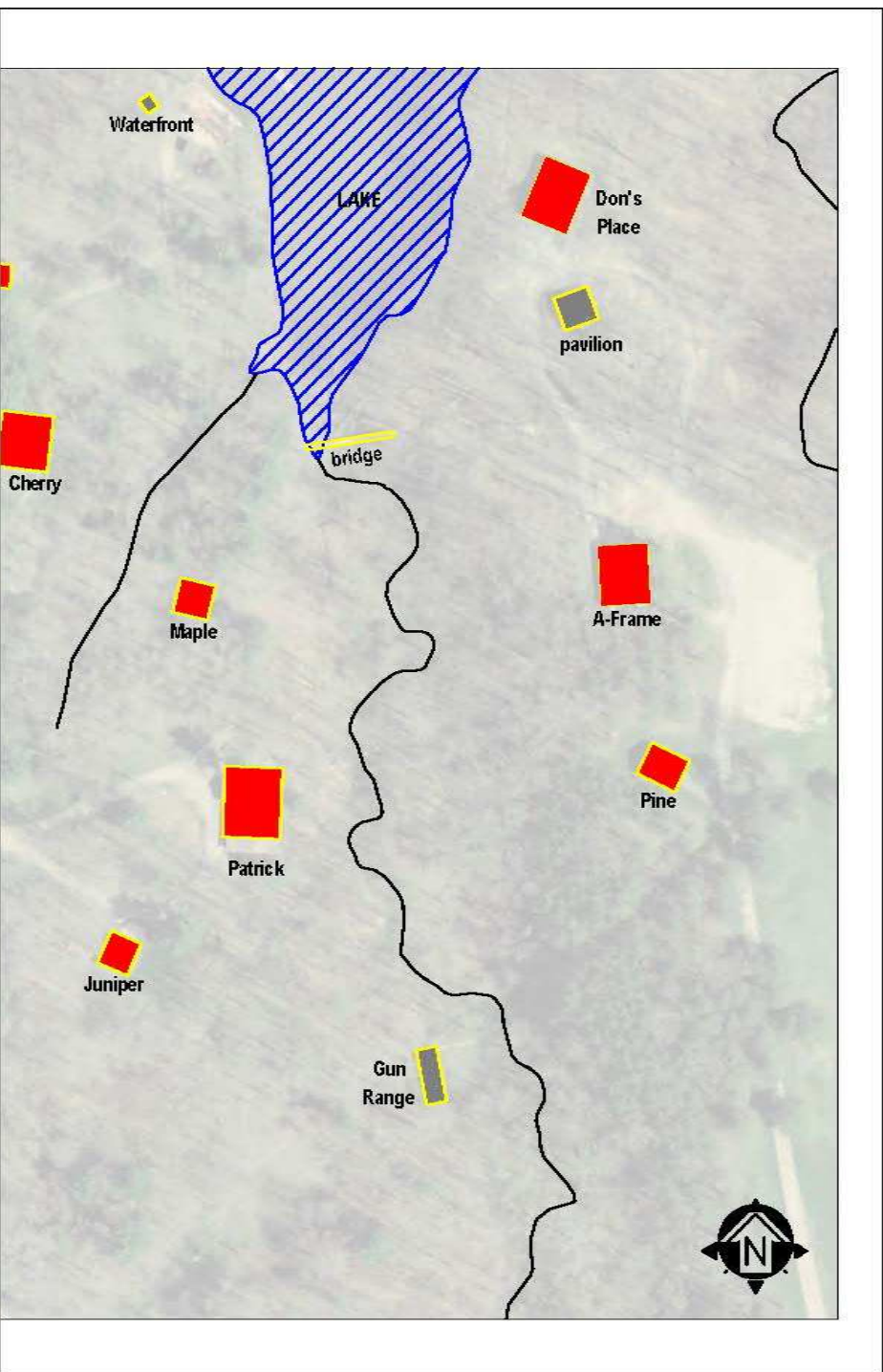

Day 4 - Group Study

Courage

A man of courage is one whose strength of mind and faith in the Lord enables him to overcome any fear of danger.

A man of courage is one who steps forward in faith to do what needs to be done. This may involve initiating action with the people around him or responding to the challenge of a situation. Fear is all about what has not happened yet. We have not been given the spirit of fear, but of power, of love, and a sound mind.

There is a quote, “The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing.”

What do you think about this quote?

There are two important facts about this quote. First, you need to know what is good and what is evil, and second, you have to have the courage to stand up for what is good.

1. What is Good?

Read: Mark 10:18

Who does Jesus say is good?

Read: Psalm 34:8

Who is good?

God sets the standard for what is good.

Read: James 1:17

What does God give us?

Read: 2 Timothy 3:10-17

What does Paul remind Timothy? (v11-12)

What does Paul encourage Timothy to do? (v14-15)

Where does scripture come from?

What is scripture good for?

We learn what is good by reading the Bible and following those that follow Christ and read the Bible.

2. What is Courage?

Read: Joshua 1:6-9

How many times does the Lord tell them to “be strong and courageous”?

In verse 7, what does the Lord tell them to “be careful” of?

We are to be strong and courageous and obey the Lord’s commands.

Read: Psalm 23

Where does David get his courage?

How does the Lord provide for David?

Read: 1 Corinthians 16:13

We are to “be on your _____; stand firm in the _____”

What do you think this verse means?

Read: Proverbs 28:1

We are to be “as bold as a _____.”

Read: Romans 8:26

How does the Spirit help us?

Read: Psalm 31:24

What are we to put our hope in?

Putting our hope in the Lord means trusting Him. He is on our side if we follow Him.

Read: 2 Timothy 1:7

God has given us a spirit “of _____, _____, and _____.”

Read: Matthew 10:33

What happens to those that deny Jesus?

When we have the courage to follow Him and stand for what is right, He is there with us.

Pray, Lord give us the courage to follow you and to stand firm in the faith. Help us to know what is good and true. Give us a spirit of power, love, and self-discipline.

Day 5 - Morning Focus

Read: Genesis 32:22-32

This is one of my favorite stories. The idea of wrestling with God is amazing. It reminds me of the times I wrestled with my own father. It is a way to test ourselves. And we need that testing.

God created just for us this amazing and beautiful world and universe. We are not here to just see it; we were meant to explore it. Ultimately, to wrestle with.

God also gave us a mind and a soul to wrestle with the spiritual truths of life. He wants us to ponder them to think about them on a deeper level. We are to mentally wrestle with them. But we have to remember we are not to find our own truth but to find THE TRUTH that comes from God Himself. We have to submit to it, and like Jacob, the Lord will bless us.

Pray: Lord, help me to dive deeper into Your Truths. Open my mind to Your wisdom and knowledge. Bless me with a spirit of curiosity in You. Amen

Day 5 - Group Study

Men of Valor must seek God and wrestle with Him

How does God give?

Then why don't we ask?

Read: Matthew 7:7-11

When we ask what will our Father in heaven give us?

Then why don't we ask for what is important?

What should we be asking God for?

Read: 1 Kings 3:5-14

What does Solomon ask for?

What did God give Solomon?

What additional things did God give Solomon?

Wrestle with God

What do you think it means to wrestle with God?

Wrestling with God is about understanding God and His nature, our relationship with Him and our nature, and all aspects of creation. The great scientist like Newton and Pascal saw science as a way of understanding the character of God.

Read: Psalm 139:23-24

What is this passage asking God to do?

We need to know what we must fix.

Read: Romans 12:2

What are we to do?

Read: Proverbs 3:5-6

We are to not lean on our own understanding. What are areas you need to give to God?

Pray: Lord, make us wise like Solomon so that we may follow you. Help us to wrestle with your wisdom and truth every day. Let us grow in our faith. Amen

Day 6 - Morning Focus

Read: Joshua 24:14-15

In the beginning part of this chapter in Joshua, he reminds the Israelites about all of the great things the Lord had done for them. Then Joshua tells them to through away all the false gods and worships the Lord. He and his family will serve the Lord. Are you willing to make that same commitment to our heavenly Father?

Always remember that you are incredibly valuable to God. He loves you and wants you to know Him. He wants to transform you and make you new. To do this, you need to fully open yourself to Jesus and give Him every part of your life. This is not something that happens overnight or at a camp; it's a lifelong journey that you have to pursue every single day. Are you willing to be a man of valor?

Lord, my prayer is for all these young men and for this young man to know You, that Your Spirit will move in him from this day forward. Make him into a man of valor. May You bless his parents and give them strength and wisdom to teach him Your ways. Thank you, Lord, for your faithfulness that you hear my prayer.

Pray: Lord, come into my life and lead me. I am yours. Amen.

Now go and be a man of valor. Give your whole heart, mind, and body to Jesus. He will never abandon you.

God's Plan of Salvation

What is God Like

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

What Are We Like

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

God's Solution

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave is only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

Your Part

What do you have to do? Jesus' death allows you to be friends with God. Here is what you have to do:

1. Believe Jesus died for you personally.
2. Tell Jesus you are sorry for the sin in your life and want to be changed.
3. Ask Jesus to take away your sins and to direct your life.

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:9)

When you give your life to Jesus, you become His child and belong to His family! Wow! What could be better?
