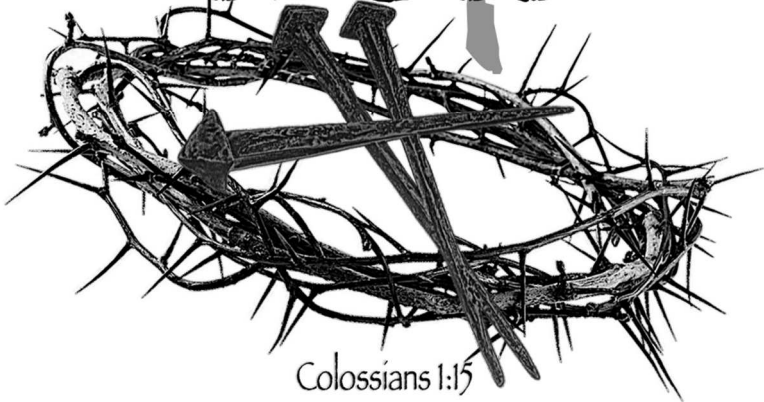

Welcome to Ohio Brigade Camp

We are so excited you could join us here at Ohio Brigade Camp. It is a place of beauty and adventure and a place dedicated to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with all those that visit. Joe Coughlin, along with a group of young Frontiersmen from across the country (with several members from Goss Memorial Church), held the first Brigade Camp in Ohio in 1945. The Milner family caught the vision and, in 1947, purchased the property which became known as Stony Glen. Ohio Brigade Camp has been held each summer at Stony Glen since 1948.

There is something special about being in the great outdoors and experiencing the adventures of Brigade Camp. It has a long history of impacting the families that come here. Some families have been coming here for multiple generations. Maybe you are part of one of those families, or maybe you are a new family and will make this a new tradition.

We hope you will have a chance to gain a new perspective on life. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning. **What you get out of camp is what you put into camp.**

What to Expect

Morning Focus

You'll begin each day with the flag raising and then your Morning Focus. This will be your morning devotion time as a family. It is a time for the family to be together with God. Here is what you need:

- Your Bible and Bible X book.
- Read the Bible passage listed in the Bible X book.
- Read the Bible X text.
- Think about what it is teaching.
- Write down any questions you may have.
- Pray.
- Study the Memory Verse.

Group Study

In the afternoon, you will meet with your cabin for a time of Group Study. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also essential to learn from and with each other. As you engage in each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar ideas and struggles. Here are some important points for the Group Study:

- Bring your Bible and Bible X book.
- This time is for you. What you put in is what you get out.
- Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others expect to hear.
- Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes.
- Ask questions. You must be willing to ask tough questions.
- Listen to the answers.
- Be ready to change your mind when presented with truth from God's Word.
- Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud.
- Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer.
- Don't ridicule others for their answers. Life is hard; we need to support one another.

You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

Cabin Devotions

After the campfire, you will have some time to do a short cabin devotion. This is a time as a cabin when you can reflect on what was said during the campfire or recap the day's lessons. Take time to discuss anything that struck you or anyone else in the cabin. This is a great opportunity to discuss how we can apply what we have learned to our personal walk with Christ.

Day 1 - Morning Focus

Read: Psalm 8:3-4

There is a story about a great king whom God created, and God gave him a vast kingdom to rule and to care for. And this king had the most beautiful bride the world has ever known. The king and his beautiful queen ruled and cared for the land and animals God had given them.

Then, one day, an evil dragon entered the kingdom. The dragon was jealous of the king and his kingdom. He wanted all that the king had. But he was a crafty dragon and knew he would not be able to defeat the mighty king if he attacked him directly. So, the sly dragon disguised himself as a lowly serpent and devised a plan to attack the king at his weakest point.

One day, the King and Queen were out in the garden, and the serpent spoke to the Queen in his sly tone, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden’?” And the Queen said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.’” But the serpent said to the Queen, “You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it, your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

Memory Verse

God gave man the responsibility to rule and care for the whole world. It was to be our perfect home. We are not the descendants of apes and of millions of years of random process and chance. We are made of greater things for a greater purpose. We all come from noble blood. That is our heritage. But... It was lost.

Adam and Eve had lost their childlike innocence. Like a toddler who runs around the house after a bath, they never understood the idea of nakedness.

Day 2 - Morning Focus

The dragon was elated, for he had destroyed the relationship between God and man. Man was now vulnerable to the dragon, and he would manipulate them even more.

But then, one day, a baby was born, and this baby was special. The dragon tried to have it killed, but God intervened, and the baby escaped. The baby grew into a man, and the dragon met him in the desert, tempted with riches and power, but his temptations didn't work like they did on the first man and woman. There was something different about this man. He had to be stopped. For three years, this man taught, and the dragon could not stop him.

Then, the moment came. The dragon convinced one of the man's followers to betray him, and the people took the man and killed him. The dragon had won again. He sat outside the tomb of this man who was to be great, a man who could do miracles. The dragon laughed to himself. He had defeated God again.

And as the dragon watched the tomb, the rock blocking the entrance began to move.

Day 3 - Morning Focus

Read: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

Through Adam and Eve, sin and death entered God's creation, and our relationship with God was broken. The dragon had corrupted the image of God that we were made in. But Jesus, the Christ, the Son of the Living God, came and defeated sin and death.

During His life, Jesus taught many things. For the rest of the week, we are going to talk about Jesus' teachings on love, service, and truth.

Jesus didn't just teach about love. His death on the cross showed us what love is. The dragon distorts what real love is. Love is not about what we get. It is about what we give.

Our love for Jesus is reflected in how we treat others. Do you love your parents? Honor them. Do you love your brothers and sisters? Be kind to them. Do you love your friends? Be there for them. Do you love your neighbor? Serve and help them. Do you love your enemies? Pray for them.

We are to be new creations—Christ makes us new—and we must show this to the world.

Pray: Lord Jesus, help me to understand what it means to show the image of God through love. Bless this day. Amen

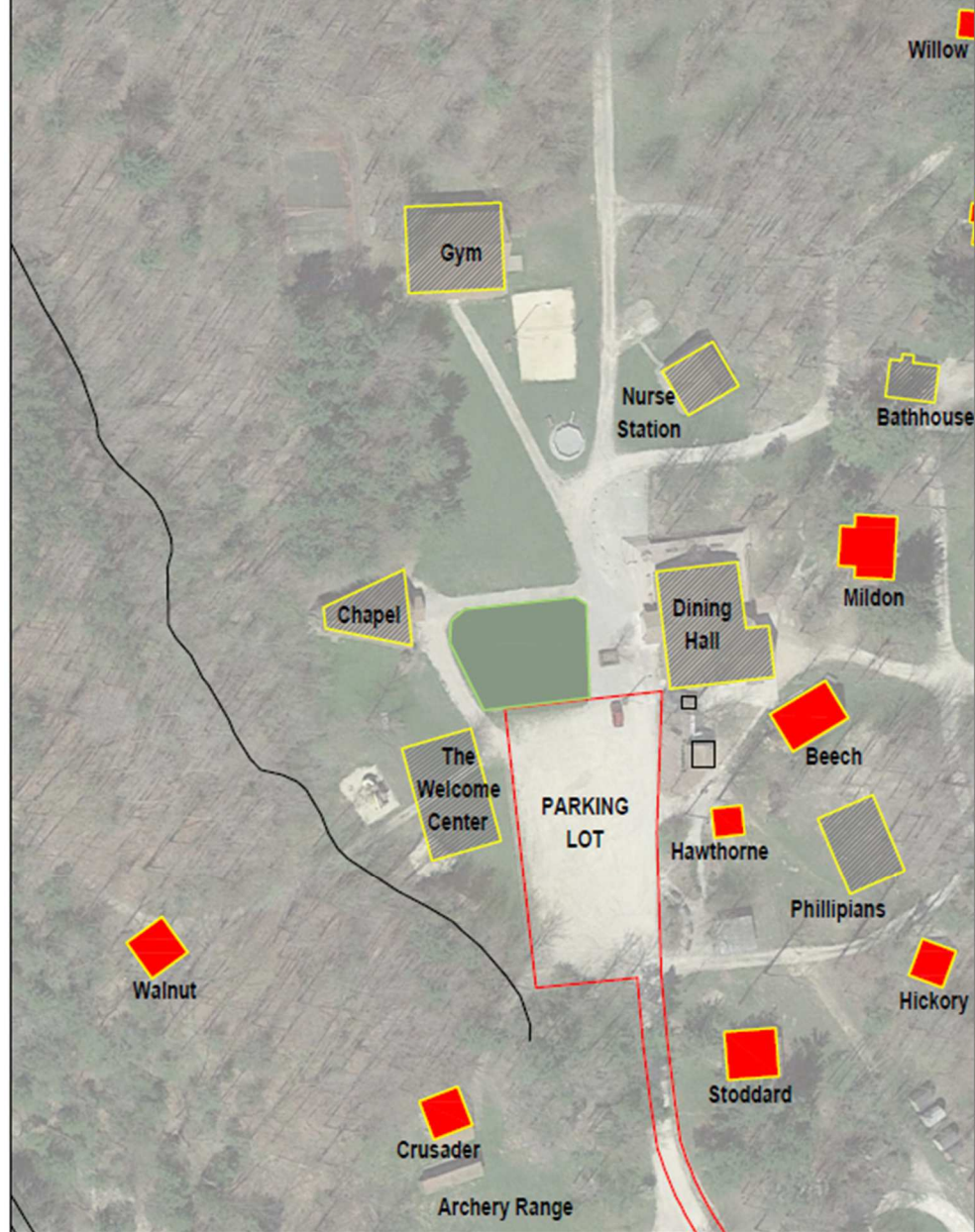

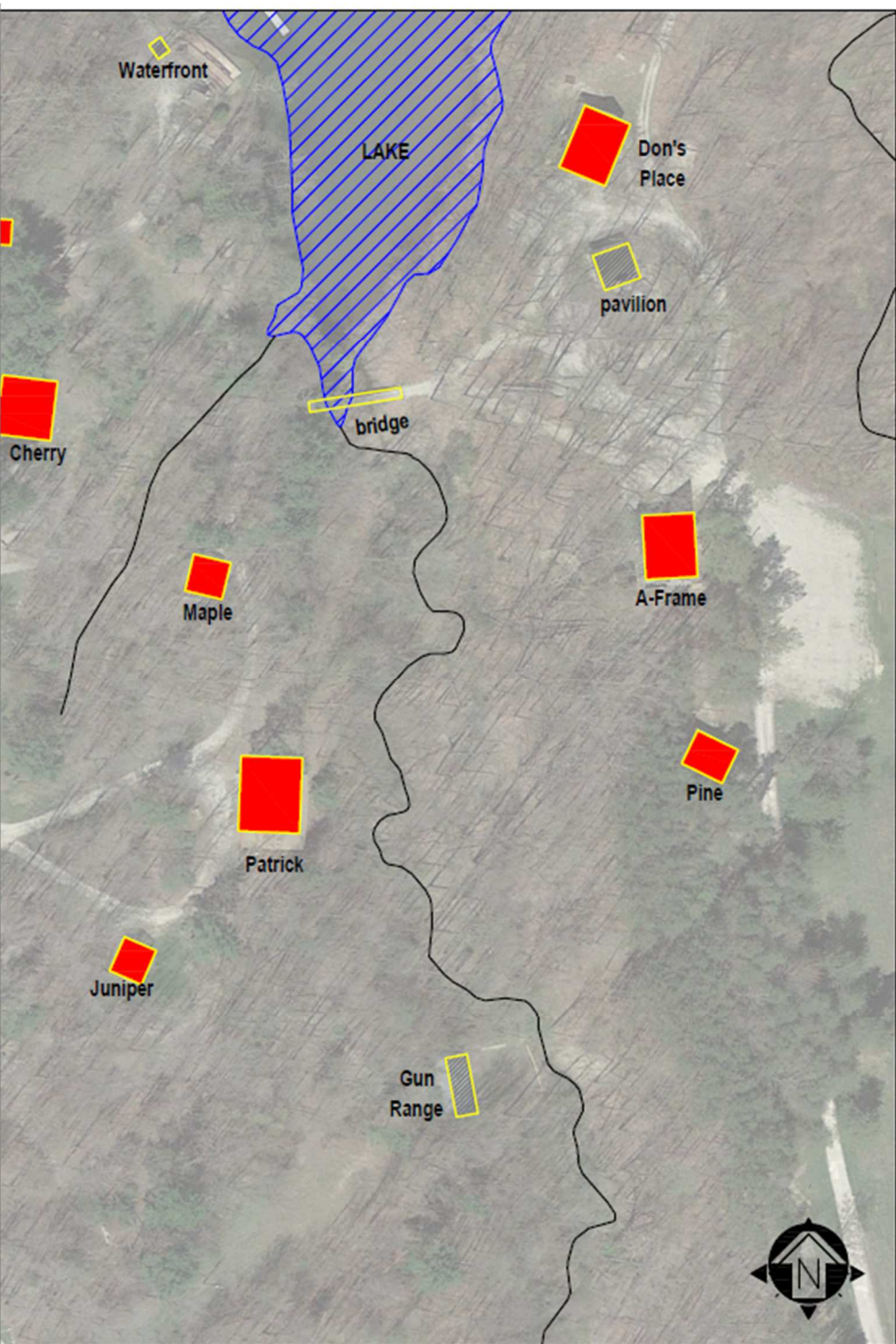

Day 4 - Morning Focus

Read: Philippians 2:5-8

Yesterday, we learned about love and its importance in showing the world how we are made in His image. Jesus' death for our sins demonstrates the kind of love we are to have for others. But love is not enough. Love is tied to service and truth.

Our enemy, the dragon, loves to distort the meaning of service just like he likes to distort the meaning of love. We see it all around us. Our first thought is how can someone serve us and not how can we serve them. We put up social media posts that get others to like what we do, and that is a way for others to serve our needs. We mock and ridicule those who work hard so we can feel better about ourselves when we should serve them by encouraging their hard work.

And when we are asked to serve or help, we complain. We only want to meet our own needs. At our heart, we are selfish.

Jesus taught his disciples a lot about service. When we serve others, we are following the second command of Jesus, to love our neighbor as ourselves. We show His image to the world through service.

Pray: Lord Jesus, help me to begin serving others the way You served others. Amen

Day 5 - Morning Focus

Read: Genesis 32:22-32

Even as Christians, the dragon likes to lie to us for, he is the father of lies. The dragon likes to continually lie to us. His goal is to get us focused on ourselves and less on God. Here is a list of common lies the dragon likes to use and the truths of God that counter these lies.

You are worthless.

You are made in the image of God.

You are a failure.

We fail so we can rely on Jesus more.

You got what you deserved.

Christ died for all so that none should perish.

You will never change.

We are made new through Jesus Christ.

You are hopeless.

Christ brings hope to the hopeless.

You are disgusting.

You are of noble blood.

You are not a real Christian.

Our identity is in Christ.

God is sick of you.

Christ died for YOU!

If people knew what you were really like, they would all hate you.

We are all sinners. We need to love each other.

It is easier to believe the lies than it is to trust in the truth. We reveal the image of God when we stand on His truth and not the lies of the dragon or the world.

Pray: Lord, reveal today your truth and help me hear it.

Truth is important to God. Look at the lies and truths listed on the previous page. Think about the lies you believe and the truths from God that defeat those lies. Remember Jesus defeated the lies of the Devil through the Truths of God.

If Jesus' purpose was to come and die for our sins, He could have just come down from heaven and died on the cross. If His purpose was to come and be king, He could have brought His angels and made Himself a king. If His purpose was to teach us how to love, He could have just come down and shown us how to love and ascend back into heaven. Jesus came down as a baby, grew up, became a carpenter, then a teacher, and then a savior defeating death. His whole life, He was under God's law (just like we are), but he never faltered. His whole life was a testament to the truth of God. No mere man could do this. Only the God-man, the Son of the Living God.

We reflect His Image by standing on His Truth! We must seek and know His truth. The true truth and not the lies of the world that some people would call truth.

Pray: Read Psalm 25:1-7 as a prayer to God. Worship Him in spirit and truth.

Day 6 - Morning Focus

Read: Joshua 24:14-15

The story of God and His battle with the dragon is real, and we are a part of that story. It is a grand story that has had many heroes and many villains. We can read about great heroes in the Bible, such as David, Gideon, Noah, Job, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and more. We have also read about great villains in the Bible and in our history books.

The battle has two sides: God's side and the dragon's side. We are either with God, or we are with the dragon. There is no neutral. You are either a hero or a villain. Are you going to be a villain, or do you have the courage and strength to be the hero of your story?

Very few of us will ever have our names written in a history book or remembered throughout history after we are gone. But that does not make our story any less important to God. For there is a book that we want our names to be written in: the Lamb's Book of Life. The Lamb's Book of Life has all the names of those who follow Jesus. He died on a cross and rose again so that your name could be written in His book. I want your name to be written there near my name.

Choose you this day to follow the Living Christ. Let the adventure begin as you follow Him and work to become the hero of your story.

Pray: Lord, help me to remember that I am made in Your Image. Guide me through this great adventure. Help me to reflect Your Image by loving You and loving others through serving and speaking truth to a world that needs to hear about You. Amen

Now go and reflect the image of the living Savior, for you were made in His image and have the stuff that makes real heroes.

God's Plan of Salvation

What is God Like

God made you and loves you. He wants you to be His child. But God is perfect and holy. He hates sin and can't even look at it.

What Are We Like

Here's the problem - all of us have sinned. We have all done many wrong things. Sin separates us from God and sin must be punished. "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

God's Solution

What's the solution? God loved you so much that He gave His only Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for your sin. Instead of punishing you, God punished Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave is only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

Your Part

What do you have to do? Jesus' death allows you to be friends with God. Here is what you have to do:

1. Believe Jesus died for you personally.
2. Tell Jesus you are sorry for the sin in your life and want to be changed.
3. Ask Jesus to take away your sins and to direct your life.

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:9)

When you give your life to Jesus, you become His child and belong to His family! Wow! What could be better?
