Welcome to Ohio Brigade Camp

We are so excited you could join us here at Ohio Brigade Camp. It is a place of beauty and adventure and a place dedicated to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with all those that visit. Joe Coughlin, along with a group of young Frontiersman from across the country (with several members from Goss Memorial Church), held the first Brigade Camp in Ohio in 1945. The Milner family caught the vision and, in 1947, purchased the property which became known as Stony Glen. Ohio Brigade Camp has been held each summer at Stony Glen since 1948.

There is something special about being in the great outdoors and experiencing the adventures of Brigade Camp. It has a long history of impacting the families that come here. Some families have been coming here for multiple generations. Maybe you are part of one of those families, or maybe you are a new family and will make this a new tradition.

We hope you will have a chance to gain a new perspective on life. Like the great new experiences of camp, here's a chance to look at the Bible in a fresh new way. Allow the truths of the Bible to give you a fresh view of life and its meaning. **What you get out of camp is what you put into camp.**

What to Expect

Morning Focus

You'll begin each day with the flag raising and then your Morning Focus. This will be your morning devotion time as a family. It is a time for the family to be together with God. Here is what you need:

- Your Bible and Bible X book.
- Read the Bible passage listed in the Bible X book.
- Read the Bible X text.
- Think about what it is teaching.
- Write down any questions you may have.
- Pray.
- Study the Memory Verse.

Group Study

In the afternoon, you will meet with your cabin for a time of Group Study. While it's important to have time alone with God, it's also essential to learn from and with each other. As you engage in each day's mission, share your thoughts and questions with the group. You will probably find that others in the group may have similar ideas and struggles. Here are some important points for the Group Study:

- Bring your Bible and Bible X book.
- This time is for you. What you put in is what you get out.
- Give honest answers and avoid the temptation to say what you think others expect to hear.
- Don't be afraid to express your doubts and questions; that's how a good investigation goes.
- Ask questions. You must be willing to ask tough questions.
- Listen to the answers.
- Be ready to change your mind when presented with truth from God's Word.
- Some questions in this Bible Exploration are personal. You don't need to give your answers out loud.
- Sometimes, though, it's great to share a 'personal' answer.
- Don't ridicule others for their answers. Life is hard; we need to support one another.

You'll probably find that others in the group feel the same way you do. You might even help somebody in his journey through this adventure we call life.

Cabin Devotions

After the campfire, you will have some time to do a short cabin devotion. This is a time as a cabin when you can reflect on what was said during the campfire or recap the day's lessons. Take time to discuss anything that struck you or anyone else in the cabin. This is a great opportunity to discuss how we can apply what we have learned to our personal walk with Christ.

DAY 1 – MORNING STUDY

Read: Romans 1:18-20

Open your eyes to God's creation. The universe reveals His majesty. All we have to do is open our eyes and our minds and let the truth of God be revealed to us through His creation and His revelation, which we call the Bible. It is His word, and it speaks to the truth of the world around us.

Our theme for this year is “No Excuses,” and it comes from Romans 1:20. Paul explains to us through his letter to the Roman believers that since the beginning, God has shown us “his eternal power and divine nature,” his “invisible qualities.” He has not hidden them, but they are “clearly seen.” And because of this, we are all “without excuse.”

This week, we will explore his creation, and when we are done, you will have “no excuses.” God made this incredible universe, and even more amazing than the universe is that he made you. And I believe you are here for a reason. So, open your eyes to God's creation. Because, when you actually look for Him, you will see His work and His presence. Jesus said in Matthew 7 verse 7, “Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.”

All you need to do is ask.

Pray: Lord, open my eyes this week to your invisible qualities and your truth. Open the eyes of all of us here at camp. Let your Spirit move so that you may be glorified. Amen.

DAY 2 – MORNING STUDY

Read: Psalm 139:13-14

Just like the Ten Commandments were given to Moses by God to help us live, God set laws to govern the universe as well. These laws make it possible for life to exist here on earth. Without them, there would be no life. The universe didn't explode into existence by chance; it was created for a reason.

There is an intellectual battle between creationism (intelligent design) and evolution. Any item that is designed has a meaning and a purpose. Evolution is based on a foundation of chance, and there is no meaning or purpose when it comes by chance.

But God says, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made." He created us for meaning and for a purpose. You are here for a reason.

It was these principles of meaning and purpose that inspired many of the founders of modern science, such as Robert Boyle, John Ray, Robert Hooke, Isaac Newton, and Michael Faraday. These men believed they could investigate the universe and make discoveries about it because the universe was made with a meaning and a purpose. It was designed.

God is infinite in knowledge and wisdom, and we only have so little of that knowledge. Many of the things we believe are actually lies. Remember this truth: you were made in the image of God and not a product of some primordial slime that happened by chance.

Pray: Lord, thank you for making me in your image. You made me for a purpose. Help me to see your truth, today. Amen

DAY 2 – GROUP STUDY

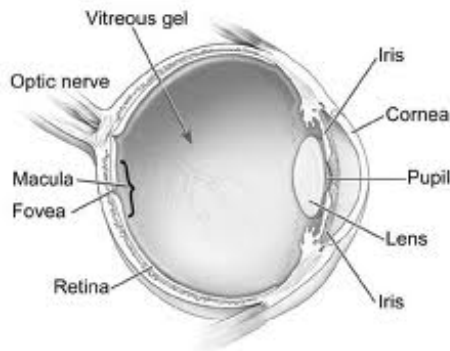

Did you notice how God created the earth using a clear step-by-step procedure?

Think about how you would build a Lego or a house – you would start with the foundation and work your way to the final product by adding the final details. And everywhere we look, God reminds us that He created it. We just have to be willing to see it.

The Theory of Evolution has many flaws and has not been proven to the point of becoming a law. The Theory of Evolution has been studied since 1859. That's 166 years, and it still has not been proven. One of my favorite issues with the Theory of Evolution is how the eye was formed.

DAY 3 – MORNING STUDY

Read: Genesis 3:1-7

Adam and Eve were made in the image of God. They were unique in God's creation. God gave them a special place in that creation. They were made to rule. As descendants of Adam and Eve, we are part of their legacy. When Adam and Eve ate the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, they disobeyed God, and because of their actions, sin and death entered the world.

Over the years, I have heard many Christians say we don't need to worry about Genesis. Science shows us that everything has evolved from something before. So, we don't need to concern ourselves with those old stories. We should focus on Jesus and the gospel.

If Genesis is just a story, then why did Jesus die for our sins? If evolution is true, sin is normal. If Genesis is just a story, then how or why did Jesus defeat death? If evolution is true, death is normal because evolution needs death and mutation to create. The Bible is clear that sin and death are not normal. They are the consequences of our disobedience of God.

If evolution is true, then we are nothing special. We are just another primate, and why would Jesus come to save just another primate? The foundation of evolution is death. The foundation of Christianity is that we are made in the image of God, and He values us so much that He sent His Son to bring us back to Him. He conquered death to give us life. Our Redeemer lives!

Pray: Lord, thank You for bringing us here so we may learn more about You. Continue to open our hearts and minds to your teaching. Lord, move or move me. Amen

Paul shows the importance of Adam and his sin and traces it to the law and Moses and how both of these point to the need for a savior, Jesus. Christ came as a new Adam. He makes all things new. He redeems us.

Read: 1 Corinthians 15:20-22

All in Adam _____, but all in Christ are made _____.

Today's study looked at the philosophical comparisons between Christianity and evolution. Most people don't look past the surface of the beliefs they hold. They just accept them. A belief in evolution requires the acceptance of death and sin as normal. Therefore, we don't need a savior. It also believes there is no ultimate purpose in life and there is nothing after death.

God tells us through the Bible that sin and death are not normal. They are the consequences of our disobedience that started with Adam. We are created in the image of God, and He gives us a purpose.

What does it mean to have a purpose?

What is your purpose? What are your talents?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our redeemer. We can't live up to your standards, but you did. You showed us that it was possible if we trusted you. Help us to be more like you. Amen.

Day 4 – Morning Study

Read: 2 Peter 3:1-7

Why is it so important to know history? History grounds us to the past and helps us prepare for the future. It helps define who we are and where we come from. When we think of history, often we think about the big events that have happened in the recent past, like the Civil War, World War I, and World War II. Or maybe you think of your history class where you had to learn the exact date of when the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock.

History is more than just dates and knowing that big events happened. It is about why they happened and understanding the significance of the events. Our view of history also impacts our view of science. Do you believe in creation or evolution? Almost all evolutionary scientists would say that believing in creation is not science.

If we believe in creation or evolution as our history and past, then we will view life and science differently. It is not two views of science (creation vs evolution) but two competing views of history. One view believes what the Bible says in Genesis and the other view believes that life spontaneously started millions of years ago. We all look at the same scientific evidence. We just interpret it differently. It is our view of history that gets us to look at science differently.

The last two days, we looked at the creation of the universe and Adam and Eve. Today, we will look at the other major event in Genesis, Noah and the Flood.

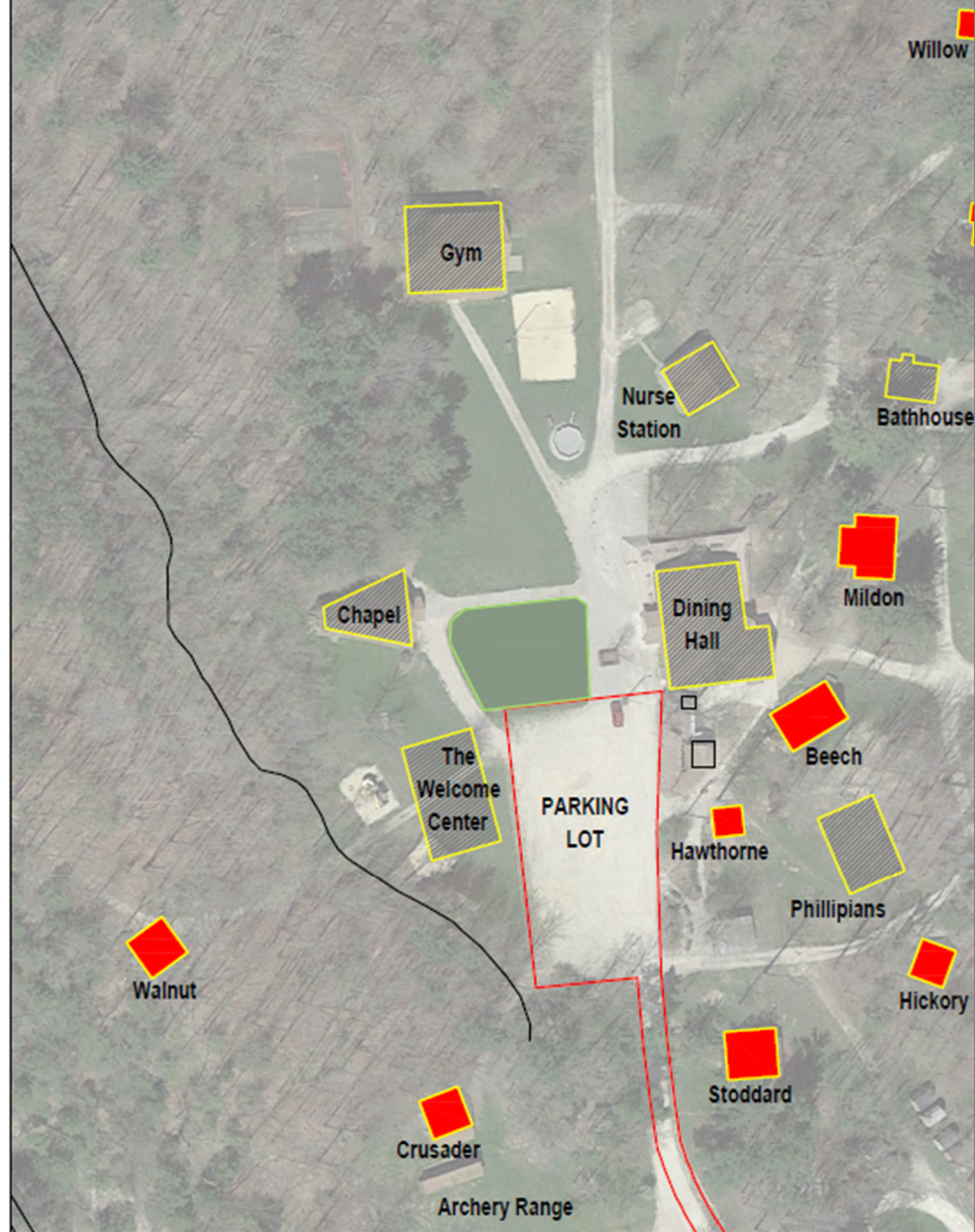
Pray: Lord, continue to open our eyes and heart to your work in our world. Help us to see you more clearly. Amen

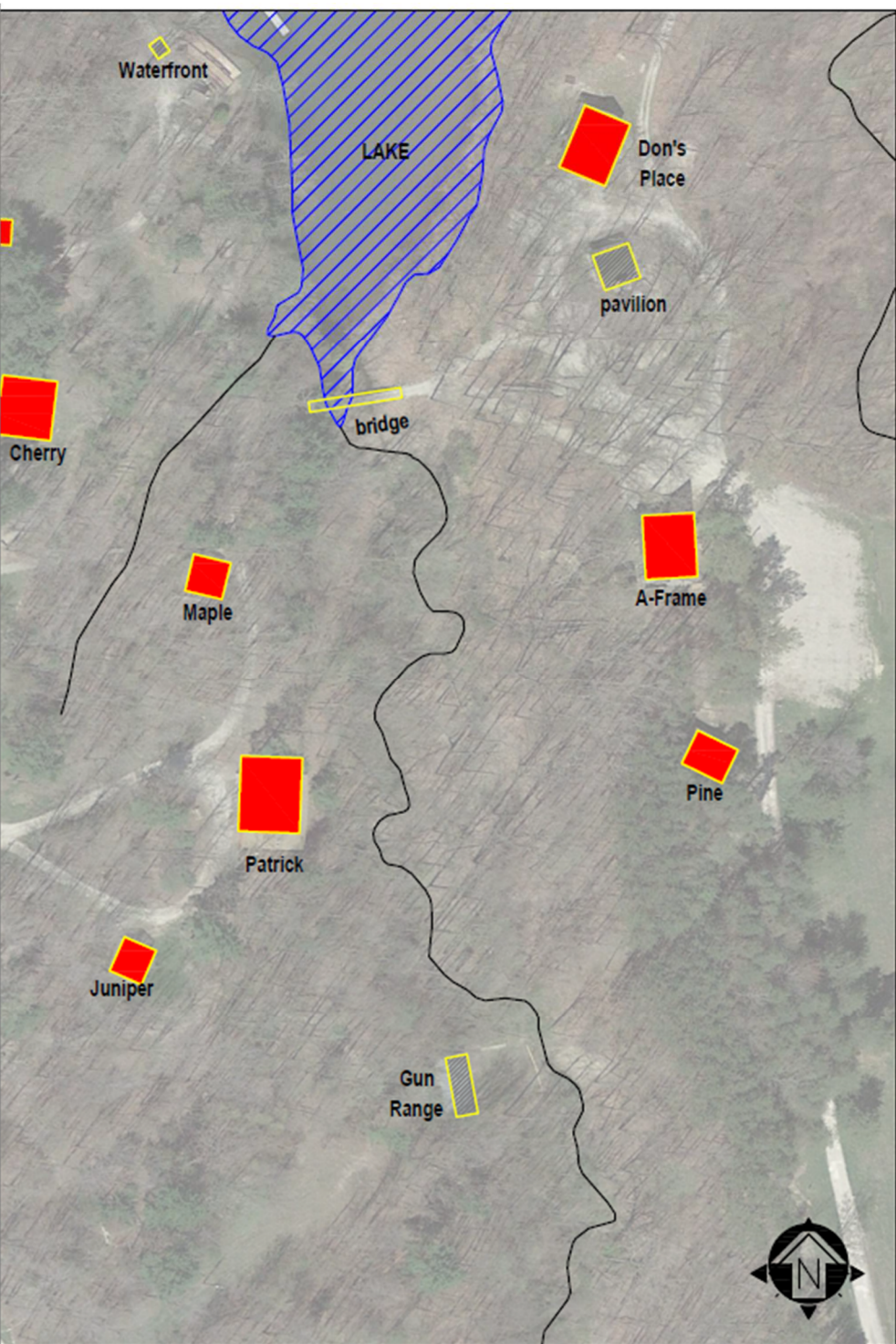

Read: 2 Peter 3:1-9

How does Peter argue against the scoffers?

Day 5 – Morning Study

Read: 1 John 1:5-10

Are you walking in darkness? There is a saying that the biggest lies we tell are the ones we tell ourselves. We walk in darkness when it comes to truly looking at who we are. Have you ever said to yourself, “Well, I’m not as bad as this person?” We all do it. But it is a lie. We are just as bad as everyone else. Maybe worse.

Men, we have no excuses. We fail God every single day. But God is faithful and merciful. He wants every one of us to know the love and forgiveness found through Jesus Christ. Our hesitation is not whether we want to believe it. Our hesitation is because of the consequences of what believing means: we will be judged for our actions. Our battle is really against sin and the fact that we actually like to sin.

Deep down, we all know what is right and wrong. The Declaration of Independence summarized this very well. *“We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.”* We know there is a God.

Today, men, we will examine who we are. I encourage you to take this opportunity to get right with God, for from this day forward, you are without an excuse. I just marvel at the fact that God created the universe just to know me.

Pray: Lord, open our hearts and minds today to your truth. Change us today so that we may be your sons, your warriors in the battle for the souls of those around us. May your Spirit come to camp and change us. May your name be glorified this day. Amen

If you already believe and follow Jesus Christ, are you really different? Are you truly following him? Jesus said, “Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life” (John 5:24)

Jesus did the one thing for us that we cannot do for ourselves, and that is the washing away of our sins. He gave us our real life back. He bought us with a price. What are you going to do about it? How will you now live? **Remember the No Excuses Pledge.** Use it to help keep you focused.

My prayer is that you will be changed. That God the Father and His son Jesus Christ, the creator and ruler of the universe, will become a true foundation for your life. That he will be the rock on which you can build a life that will be truly amazing. It is the greatest adventure of all.

If every one of us left this camp with a desire to follow Christ, the impact in our community and in our families could change the lives of so many people who need to hear the Gospel, the good news of Jesus, the Lord of lords, and the savior of all.

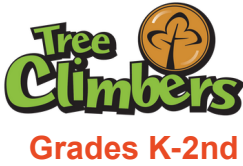
